



LOW SPEED VEHICLE (LSV) REGULATIONS



If you operate a LSV:

- You may not drive LSVs on roadways with speed limits that exceed 25 mph.
- Child restraints in LSVs must meet the same standards as those used in passenger vehicles.
- You must have a valid driver license to operate a LSV.
- You are subject to the same violations as other vehicles (except for inspection requirements).
- All LSVs shall have a safety information decal from the manufacturer on the rear of the vehicle.
- If you have only one license plate, you must put it on the rear of the vehicle.
- LSVs must meet Federal and State requirements including;
 - Headlamps;
 - Front and rear turn signal lamps, Tail lamps, Stop lamps;
 - Red reflex reflectors: one on each side as far to the rear as possible and one on the rear of the vehicle;
 - An exterior mirror mounted on the driver's side of the vehicle and either an exterior or interior mirror mounted on the passenger's side;
 - A parking brake;
 - A windshield that meets FMVSS 205;
 - A Vehicle Identification Number (VIN); and
 - A seat belt assembly installed at each designated seating position.
 - Additional State requirements
 - Adequate brakes to control the movement of the vehicle;
 - An odometer;
 - A speedometer
