

#### Distributor Maintenace

The distributor must be lubricated and the best time is when the oil is changed.
Did you know that there are two places for lubrication?
The first is the one that is very visible, the oil


The first is the one that is very visible, the oil cup on the side

The other one, not so much. If you take off the rotor, you will see (or should see) a small piece of felt inside the shaft. That should be oiled at the same time. The oiled felt drips on the weights and springs below the plate. Even if you have an electronic conversion like a Pertronix,, the felt piece should be oiled.
