## **Instructor's Meeting Video Nights**

Instructor's Meeting and Movie Night News from Chris Getter, training committee member. We've had two combination instructor's meeting and movie nights . The first was February 10th with a meeting at 6:30 and a DVD entitled Engagement Skills with Forrest Micke at 7:00 . This video explains how to get your dog totally focused on you, the dog wants to be with you, and it wants what you have. What you have is either a high value food reward or a high value toy reward. If you are a trainer who wants to develop a relationship with your dog where the dog looks forward to your training sessions then you need to learn about engagement. This video will show you how to keep your dog engaged during training sessions and how to put engagement on cue. This DVD is in our library.

On April 7 we had our second combination instructor's meeting and movie night. This event was not well attended. At our instructor's meeting we discussed the goals of a good obedience club. We discussed some problems in teaching classes and how to address them . Claudia Sonnenberg gave a demonstration of some of the new rally signs and Nancy Schmitt gave us a preview of her new Perch class that she will be teaching during the summer session.

At 7:00 we showed the DVD entitled The Power of Training Dogs with Food with Michael Ellis . This video covers the basics of food rewards as a motivational training method. It highlights important engagement techniques including a review of the marker system in regards to training behaviors, as well as the luring technique. This DVD is also in our library.

The next instructor meeting will be on June 2nd. Anyone interested in instructing is welcome. Again a DVD will be shown at 7:00. Everyone is invited. The DVD will be Training the Recall with Michael Ellis. Having a solid recall command is the most important behavior you can train your dog. This DVD offers a step by step training regimen that is both simple and fun for you and your dog. It begins with restrained recalls, then distraction free recalls, and eventually recalls with distraction.

Mark June 2nd on your calendar and come and enjoy. The DVD will last about 1 hour. Remember our Achievement Trial will be on May 23. Come out to help with stewarding or judging, or enter your dog and see how well you've done with your training.

Chris Getter called the meeting to order at 6:35 p.m. She explained the purpose of tonights meeting was goals of a good dog obedience club.

- To provide a means of educating the dog owner so that he or she has a controlled, well mannered dog.
- To provide that education in such a manner that the dog owner can learn the material and will accept it.
- To provide opportunities for the dog owner who wishes to go onto more advanced training.
- To provide counseling for the owner with a problem dog, the owner who has problems or simply the dog owner with questions.

She then went into what is a good instructor? Someone who loves to teach. Lecturing is not teaching. Explain, demonstrate, and then let the students try. Be patient, (everyone learns differently). Find reasons to praise your students. Just like the dog your students need to hear praise and know when they are right. But please don't use a student's dog to demo unless you know that dog and have a relationship with that dog. If a student asks you to take their dog, be very careful handling the dog. If I give my dog off to a stranger I can damage the trust my dog has in me. Often a dog that looks harmless when put in an uncomfortable situation can lash out and the instructor gets bit. That is a no win situation for everyone. If you need to demonstrate with a dog use your own dog.

A good instructorcan read dogs and decide if the dog is aggressive, submissive, dog aggressive or simply exhibiting adolescent behavior.

A good instructor tries as hard to teach the difficult or negative student as they do the easy cooperative student.

Some things I would like to see happening in future classes:

- Lets begin each class with a session of engagement. If you weren't here las time and did not watch the video please take it from the library to understand the value of engagement as a precursor to training the dog.
- In our pre novice and novice classes we need to start teaching the fold back down and the kick back stand.
- Tonight's video will explain what we call "Marker Training".

Claudia Sonnenberg, Rally chairperson, also demonstrated and had available some of the new Rally signs being put out as of November 1, 2017.

Nancy Schmitt explained the Perch class that she is having during the summer session at 9 a.m. Instructors are encouraged to sign up for this if available as it is during the day. Auditing spots are available. There is no charge for this.

The meeting ended at 7:10 p.m. and the DVD on Markers was shown.
