I mean, there are some ministries (Wednesday Night Fellowship, Choir, Bell Choir) that perhaps need a little time off so that folks can take a little breather, regroup and prepare for the comeback! But God doesn't take a vacation from us, so why would we take one from Him?

With that in mind, this past summer has been one of the best of my 19 years in the ministry. Yes, some ministries took some time off. But for the most part, there was very little "let down" around here this Summer. Instead, we kept right on pushing, focusing on connecting more people to Jesus Christ. And that fact makes this Fall even sweeter!

Even though we didn't really let down over the Summer, we are neck-deep in the "new life" of Fall right now! Wednesday Night Fellowship is back. The Choir is back. The Bell Choir is back. And suddenly, in the midst of a world outside the doors of the church that is beginning to shut down for the Winter, we are experiencing Spring inside the building!

Not only does faith not have to be dull and boring- it SHOULDN'T be! WE serve a living God. We have been saved by His grace and made new through His salvation. We have the best story ever to share. THE BEST! We should want to share that story with a world that so desperately needs to hear it. Christianity isn't some dull, boring, ancient ritual that we muddle through every Sunday. OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

Our mission is to connect people to Jesus Christ. What better way to plant the seed of Christ's love than to do so with a child? **Operation Christmas Child** brings joy and hope to children in desperate situations world-wide through simple, gift-filled shoeboxes that show God's love.



Last year, the Aledo United Methodist Church donated 205 shoeboxes to this wonderful Christian mission project. Those were 205 children who may not have received anything to celebrate the birth of our Lord. That is also 205 families who witnessed God's love first-hand. What a wonderful blessing for both the recipient and the giver.

Boxes may be filled with dozens of items. Along with items like school supplies, jump ropes, t-shirts, small stuffed toys, small cars, please consider hygiene items in your box as well. Dr. and Mrs. Gary Olson are donating a toothbrush for each box. Other hygiene items could include toothpaste, bar soap (place in a plastic, zip-lock bag and/or a soap dish), washcloths, hair combs and brushes. Once again this year, our church is supplying 2 pencils for each shoebox. These items, which we may take for granted, may be the only such items that these children have all year. Can we count on YOU to get on board to help a child in need? If you can help in any way, it will be appreciated greatly by the children!

Each box should be accompanied with \$7.00 to cover the shipping. Your check should be made payable to Samaritan's Purse and placed in an envelope INSIDE the box. In the case of multiple box donations, <u>only one check</u> is needed to cover the cost of shipping for all. Just follow the instructions in the brochure to get your box ready to send! (Cash donations are welcome as well. Extra money will be used for necessary postage and/or extra items for shoeboxes.) You may pick up a "list" of possible items to pack in your box at the shoebox center in the Fellowship Room, October 4th.

Participants for this simple, hands-on mission project can be people of all ages. The participants do not have to be a member of this church. The focus of the project is the true meaning of Christmas—the birth of Jesus Christ. Just imagine the looks on the children's faces as they open their box to find all those treasures. For many of these children, it will be like a dream come true.

Beginning Sunday, October 4th, you may visit the **OCC Table/Center** located in the Fellowship Cafe for shoeboxes, pencils, toothbrushes, brochures, labels, and a display of wonderful pictures of children who have their boxes! **Boxes must be collect-ed and brought to the church by November 8**. So, if you haven't done so already, now is the time to begin finding small items for your shoebox. You may use the official shoeboxes provided, or use regular shoeboxes. The regular shoeboxes may be wrapped in Christmas paper (**lid must be wrapped separately from the bottom**) or plastic totes can be used. You are not limited to one box...you may fill as many as you want and we encourage you to do just that.

If you don't know for sure if you want to participate, please take some time to think about it. Pray about it. Decide for yourself if you and your family are willing to share the blessings God has given you with a child who is less fortunate. Let the world know that "God is Good!"



Columbus Day

Celebrating the anniversary of Christopher Columbus's arrival in the Americas (which occurred on October 21, 1492), Columbus Day became a federal holiday in 1970. However, its American roots go much deeper. In 1792, New York City and other eastern U.S. cities celebrated the 300th anniversary of his landing in the New World. In 1892, President Benjamin Harrison called upon the people of the United States to celebrate Columbus Day on the 400th anniversary of the event. Columbus Day was first popularized as a holiday in the United States through the lobbying of Angelo Noce, a first generation Italian living in Denver. On Sunday, September 13th, we began not one but TWO NEW sermon series. At both 8AM and 10:15AM, we dove into The Compass: A Vision Quest. The final week of this series looks like this: Sunday, October 4- Outreach (1Peter 2:9-12) Outreach is reaching beyond our walls to connect people to Jesus. (Jeremiah 29:11-13, Matthew 28:16-20) Then, on October 11, we begin a new morning series- The Exodus. The story of Moses and the Hebrews is a powerful reminder of OUR lives...and the impact God can have on them. The weeks of this series look like this: Sunday, October 11- Bondage (Exodus 1:6-13) Some days, life can be just plain hard! (Psalm 34:18-20, Romans 8:26-27) Sunday, October 18- Trust (Exodus 2:1-4) To get where God is sending us, we have to trust. (Proverbs 3:5-8, Matthew 6:25-27) Sunday, October 25- Running (Exodus 2:11-15) We can run from our mistakes, but we can't hide from God. (Jonah 1:1-3, John 3:18-21) Sunday, November 1- Called (Exodus 3:1-5) There comes a moment in everybody's life when God's call can't be denied. (1Samuel 3:1-4, 2Timothy 1:7 -9a) Sunday, November 8- Promise (Exodus 5:22-6:2) God is always with us, regardless of the circumstance. (Psalm 23, 2Peter 3:9) Sunday, November 15- Release (Exodus 12:31-34) Being obedient to God leads to a feeling that cannot be equaled. (Daniel 6:16-22, 1Corinthians 10:13) Sunday, November 22- Freedom (Exodus 14:26-31) God offers us freedom...true freedom. (2Chronicles 7:14, Galatians 5:1) At The Point- 6PM on Sundays- we have been walking through the 6 Steps to Grace. Grace is, no pun intended, an amazing thing. But what IS it? The final 3 weeks of this series look like this: Sunday, October 4- Confessing (Romans 10:4-11) Thinking it isn't enough- we need to confess our faith in God. Sunday, October 11- Baptizing (Romans 6:1-4) When we are baptized, we become new creatures in Christ. Sunday, October 18- Committing (Luke 10:1-9) Stepping out in faith makes all the difference in the world. Then, on October 25, we start a new evening series- God's Promises. We will spend 5 weeks looking at 5 specific things God promises in His Word. The weeks of this series look like this: Sunday, October 25- Forgiveness (Matthew 18:21-35) Forgiveness is the attribute of the strong. Sunday, November 1- Salvation (Luke 19:1-10) Trust Jesus alone for your salvation. Sunday, November 8- Comfort (John 11:17-33) Jesus preserves our heart and secures our comfort. Sunday, November 15- Peace (John 16:29-33) First find peace within yourself, then you can offer peace to others. Sunday, November 22- Blessing (Mark 10:13-16) Everyday is a new blessing from God. Come each week expecting God to speak to you in powerful ways!
