GRADING.

Grades will be based on the following criteria:

1. Regular practice evaluation.

Each student is observed during the first class of each week to determine if the assigned practice and exercises have been completed. (2 points per week).

2. Performance evaluations: There will be two major performance and written evaluations during the semester as well as the Final Exam. (See assignment sheet for dates.)

Performance evaluations will be based on the following factors:

a. Accuracy of notes

- b. Rhythmic accuracy
- c. Fingering
- d. Expression
- e. Exercises

3. Written exams.

There will be three written tests on the same days as the performance evaluations.

The final grade will be based on the following formula:

Performance evaluations ----	50% of total grade
Written exams -----	25% of total grade
Weekly class performance----	25% of total grade (2% per week)

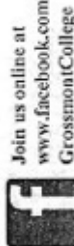
