From the Minister's Mac: The Book of Straw

If you know your Church history, you may know that Martin Luther detested the book of James. He called it a book of straw and said he would not have it in his Bible, although he never actually went so far as to suggest that it should be taken out of the Bible altogether. He did, however, frequently condemn it and said it was far inferior to the Epistles of the Apostle Paul and should not be compared to them.

Luther's problem with the letter centered primarily on one verse:
"You see that a person is justified by works and not by faith alone."

Luther felt that by lifting up this idea, clerics and theologians were encouraging people to incorrectly believe that they might earn their way to heaven by acts of piety and mercy. Go to church. Pray. Care for the sick. Feed the hungry. Seek justice. Visit the imprisoned. And gain eternal life.

Of course, that's not how I read the book of James (you knew that was coming, didn't you?). With all due respect for the great reformer, Martin Luther, over the next few Sundays, we'll explore the Epistle of James, and consider why what James has to say about our Christian journey might be just what we need to hear in the 21st Century.

"I sat down and crunched some numbers. In 4 months, I paid off over \$11,200.24 in credit card debt. I expect to be debt free in the next 2 months.

In a way, I live in Baby Step 3. Well, I use the key takeaways from that step often anyway. If I am faced with temptation, I ask myself - Is it necessary? I can usually stop there, but if I say yes, then I ask myself if it is urgent or unexpected? I apply this logic to EVERY purchase that isn't the same amount every time - like insurance premiums, phone bill, dog food, etc.

In the past, I tracked my spending and called it a budget. Now, I know how to create a budget and I stick with it. I actually enjoy doing a spreadsheet. I set my receipts aside, log into my bank app on my phone, and I sit in front of my computer and handle my budget once a week. When you make it routine, it becomes habit, and habits become second

nature. "

This person will recognize a \$2800 "raise" every month. Removing that burden of debt now allows them more freedom to handle emergencies, save an 3-6 months emergency fund, invest, and plan ahead for purchases that they would like to make. Great Job!!!! Michael Rowley – FPU Coordinator
