The SCOOP on PGAA

We are members of an amazing organization of people who worked diligently to organize in just the right way twenty-years ago. Thanks to them, RMGA members reap the benefits today!

The seed of the idea for Rocky Mountain Guides Association is lost to the shadows of time, but guides across the country were simultaneously thinking about the benefits of banding together to have a presence, a voice and a standard for our part of the tourism industry. It was around 1987 when guides in the Denver area began to meet sporadically—at breakfast, lunch, or evening meetings. These included speakers and business meetings—sometimes very *l-o-o-o-n-g* evening business meetings!!

A steering committee was designated to begin the work of building a stable organization. Several in the group knew there were those attempting to start an organization for guides throughout the United


States. They called their embryonic idea "The Professional Guides Association of America". Other related groups from across the country had already formed.

Two men, Ed and Michael, set up an office in Washington, D.C., to draw in chapters of guides, tour managers, destination management and motorcoach companies, and others in the industry. Since there were guide/guild groups in some cities, Denver was Chapter #1 to join this new organization. It was called the Rocky Mountain Chapter of the Professional Guide Associations of America. In reality, Denver was the only group to form precisely to join PGAA. Other guide/guild groups previously formed were allowed to join, but they did not become chapters.

Thus, Denver was joined together with Boston, Massachusetts, New York City, New York, Washington, D. C., Savannah, Georgia, and others to set standards and promote their professional services. A governing board helped the local chapter and other groups to coalesce. New associations coming together contributed ideas and shared information. Over-the-road guides and local guides got to know one another. This sharing was exciting, helpful to all.

Then-member **Joan Fitch** spent hours on conference calls with the new headquarters in D.C. in order to get Denver up-to-speed. **Ruby Ellen Hale**, Joan, and others spent a similar number of hours and meetings putting ideas into action. Others in Colorado contributed their share of hours to the endeavor, determined to make this group work. Joan Fitch became the national president of PGAA; a national convention was held in Denver in 1991. (We seem to have "good DNA" in RMGA—hard workers willing hands and a determination to do our best!)

Next month you will be surprised to hear of people you know who gave so much time and talent since the beginning, with PGAA to the progression of the organization, Rocky Mountain Guides Association. Many of them continue to support and participate with us today.




RMGA Facebook Group


