



#### KANONKOP WINES AND CHÂTEAU D'ORIGNAC COGNACS

Kanonkop, renowned for its mastery of Pinotage and Cape Blends, is a benchmark of South African winemaking. With iconic wines like the Black Label Pinotage and Paul Sauer, Kanonkop represents the pinnacle of craftsmanship in the Stellenbosch region.

We are also proud to introduce Château d'Orignac, a fine Cognac producer known for its premium blends. This addition brings a new dimension to our growing selection of craft spirits, offering a sophisticated choice for your collection.

These additions strengthen our commitment to offering a curated range of premium wines and spirits, perfect for elevating any selection.

#### **NEW OFFICE**

Our new location is in the heart of Westlands. We relocated to Capital West Business Center on Lantana road, Westlands. We are more central and very excited for this leap as our team of exceptional individuals grows.











Château d'Orignac is an exquisite vineyard and distillery nestled in the heart of Cognac's Fins Bois appellation near the Gironde estuary. Fins Bois is one of the six Crus in Cognac where the main varietal Ugni Blanc covers about 98% of the 75,000 hectares of vineyards. Ugni Blanc is ideal for cognac due to its high yield, quality and acidity making it perfect for distillation.

Spanning over 20 hectares and still a family home, Château Orignac has been producing grapes for at least 800 years. Hubert Meyer acquired the estate in 1920 during a period when the Phylloxera virus was ravaging European vineyards. Fortunately, Hubert imported Phylloxera-resistant rootstocks from America and grafted his vines onto them. This innovation made him a sought-after supplier, leading to significant success. With his fortune, he acquired properties for his four daughters, including Orignac.

Yvan Meyer, Hubert's great-great-grandson, has run Château d'Orignac for 28 years alongside his father Hervé, producing both cognac and Pineau des Charentes. Yvan has preserved the estate's legacy while modernizing its practices, maintaining the character of its products. He prioritizes soil health, practicing organic farming with natural cow manure and planting mustard and clover postharvest to enrich the soil. The estate cultivates Ugni Blanc and Colombard for cognac and Merlot and Cabernet for Pineau.

Production remains artisanal with blending and bottling done onsite. After double distillation, the cognac is aged in Limousin oak barrels, where alcohol naturally evaporates over time, reducing from about 55% to the final 40% ABV. This gradual evaporation, known as the "angel's share," allows the cognac to achieve its refined balance. Yvan's approach focuses on patience, letting flavours, acidity, and alcohol harmonize over years of maturation.

Professionally, he also serves as winemaker and technical director at Maison Sichel overseeing brands like Sirius and Château Argadens. Château d'Orignac's cognacs are renowned for their rich, complex profiles, balancing fruity and floral notes with hints of vanilla, spice, and a nuanced oaky character. The estate's cellars, with over 100 years of perfect humidity and conditions, play a vital role in aging. Château d'Orignac produces VSOP and XO cognacs, aged for at least

three and ten years respectively. Yvan's signature XO blend combines 10-12 year old cognacs for their fruity character with older cellared cognacs to add complexity. Despite its 40% ABV, the XO remains remarkably soft and rounded.

Beyond their own production, Château d'Orignac is among 4,200 g rowers contributing to the local cognac-making community, c ollaborating with neighbouring producers to uphold traditional methods while embracing sustainable viticulture innovations.



# The original First Growth wine estate

Kanonkop was grown from completely barren land with a lot of hard work, sheer determination and instinctive innovation behind it. Four generations of family and four long-serving winemakers have made the Estate what it is today to fulfil the vision that their patriarch Paul Sauer had when he founded the Estate.

When the first vintage, a 1973 Cabernet Sauvignon was released, this was the turning point for Kanonkop. Unfortunately, Paul never got to taste the first vintage that became a marker of excellence for Kanonkop wines.

Kanonkop itself is steeped in history. The name refers to the butte (kop) on the Simonsberg Mountain above the estate where cannon shots were fired in the 17th century to signal the arrival of ships in Table Bay. Now a symbol of South African viticultural heritage, Kanonop is celebrated for its world-class red wines, particularly Pinotage and Cabernet Sauvignon.

Four generations of family involvement and four dedicated winemakers have carried forward the legacy and vision of Paul Sauer. Today, under the leadership of his grandsons Johann and Paul Krige, the estate continues to uphold tradition, excellence and innovation, ensuring Kanonkop remains at the pinnacle of winemaking.

#### The Beginning

In 1929, Paul Oliver Sauer received approximately 85 hectares of virgin land from his mother, Mary Sauer, who had just sold her house to a German Baron. She wisely set aside the adjacent land for her only son who had ambitions of becoming a farmer. Paul had already started planting fruits and wine grapes on their former farm, making the gift an ideal foundation for what would become Kanonkop. Around this time, Paul was also elected to the South African parliament, where he served for over two decades. His modest £900 annual salary supported his young family and helped manage the farm but it was far from easy. Paul purchased two wooden shipping containers from the Baron to serve as a farm office and as housing for his farm manager Danie Rossouw, who would later become Kanonkop's first winemaker.

#### The Work

Although Paul aspired to grow vineyards and produce wine, he needed to sustain his farm. Initially, he and Danie planted pear and plum orchards but World War II halted all exports, forcing a shift to viticulture. The fruit trees were removed and the land cleared for planting Shiraz, Cinsault and the experimental Pinotage - a cross between Pinot Noir and Hermitage. In 1942, Paul built a cellar still in use today, where grapes are fermented in the original open concrete tanks. At

the time, the wine industry was controlled by corporations like the Stellenbosch Farmers Winery (SFW) that bought grapes and wine from winemakers and bottled them under different brands, similar to Bordeaux cooperatives. This model provided Kanonkop with income to expand its vineyards, which by the 1960s covered 110 hectares including Cabernet Sauvignon, Chenin Blanc, Riesling and Clairette Blanch. Even then, Kanonkop's terroir was evident to wine experts and the estate was flourishing under Paul's stewardship.

#### Winemakers of Distinction

Kanonkop's soul lies in the hands of its winemakers, each one leaving an indelible mark on its history. Danie Rossouw, the estate's first winemaker in the 1940s, prioritised quality over quantity, setting the standard for Kanonkop's meticulous winemaking philosophy. In 1968, Danie's passed the reins to Jan 'Boland' Coetzee, a viticulture and oenology graduate from the University of Stellenbosch, who became a Springbok rugby player during his tenure. Needless to say, the 'Springbok in the Cellar' added to Kanonkop's allure. Jan quickly enhanced the estate's reputation through his instinct for terroir. First, he replaced the Shiraz vines with Cabernet Sauvignon resulting in Kanonkop's first estate wine, the 1973 Cabernet Sauvignon. Remarkably, this exceptional wine came from four year old vines. Jan also recognised the soil's high acidity and brought in limestone to improve PH levels, benefitting the estate's renowned Pinotage and Cabernet Sauvignon to this day. Jan's innovative spirit was evident when he used his hunting rifle to mark vine planting rows on bare land-a testament to his resourcefulness.

In 1981, Jan moved on and Beyers Truter, a young oenologist and rugby player stepped in, inheriting 28 workers, 1000 tons of grapes ready for harvest and a highly expectant market. Beyers embraced mentorship and camaraderie ensuring a smooth transition. He experimented with colour and tannin extraction, refining Kanonkop's punch-down technique, now a hallmark of the estate. Known as

the 'Prince of Pinotage', Beyers championed the varietal, showcasing its potential with new French oak barrels. His efforts culminated in winning the Robert Mondavi Trophy at the 1991 International Wine and Spirit Competition for Best Winemaker in the World-a win for Kanonkop and South African wine. During his tenure, the Paul Sauer Bordeaux-style blend was introduced, which remains one of South Africa's finest wines.

After 22 years, Beyers was leaving

After 22 years, Beyers was leaving Kanonkop and he had found the right man to take over as cellar master and winemaker.

While working on the estate's celebrated Pinotage wines, Beyers met a young Abrie Beeslar, then an assistant winemaker. Abrie's enthusiasm, skill and passion for the Pinotage varietal stood out. He became Beyer's trusted right-hand man at Kanonkop before being asked to succeed him in 2003. Like his predecessor, Abrie stepped into the role before he was 30 years old inheriting the challenge of living up to three legendary figures. It was not going to be an easy task to follow three great legends. Johann Krige's advise to him in the beginning made it clear: at Kanonkop, the wheel did not need reinvention.

Abrie got to work blending his instinct with expertise to uphold Kanonkop's commitment to excellence. He recognized that the terroir dictates a wine's character, closely monitoring the grapes from the vineyard through fermentation and barrel aging. For Abrie, a wine's time in the barrel should enhance, not dominate its essence. This meticulous approach has earned him the title of International Winemaker of the Year three times, solidifying his place in Kanonkop's storied legacy.

#### The Krige Brothers

Devoted custodians of Paul Sauer's legacy, Paul and Johann Krige embody Kanonkop's spirit and vision.

The younger of the two, Paul Krige returned to the estate after serving in South Africa's Navy elite diving unit and pursuing a promising rugby career cut short by injury.

At the time, 80% of Kanonkop wines


However, the Pinotage, Cabernet Sauvignon and Paul Sauer Bordeaux-style blend were gaining acclaim among wine connoisseurs. Paul and Beyers took to the road, personally delivering cases of wine to potential retail customers in Johannesburg. Over time, the longest queues at wine shows were consistently found at Kanonkop's stand.

Johann meanwhile, had built a successful corporate law career but felt drawn back to the family wine business. Determined to elevate Kanonkop to global prominence, he joined a major wine corporation to learn about international markets before returning with a clear strategy: focus.

The first step was regaining full control of production by severing ties with the SFW in the mid 1980s. This allowed the estate to set appropriate pricing for its high quality wines.

Next, the brothers narrowed Kanonkop's focus exclusively to red wines, eliminating other grape varieties. This ensured skilful attention to detail and maintained quality as the cornerstone of their operation. Their uncompromising standards were evident in decisions like declining to release the 1996 Pinotage due to a fault and globally recalling the 1998 vintage over a cork taint. These bold moves reinforced their reputation for excellence and cemented the foundation for Kanonkop's modern success.

Today, under the Krige brothers' hands-on leadership, Kanonkop remains a family-run estate where every decision reflects their dedication to the craft. Unsurprisingly, Kanonkop boasts some of the most coveted wine Awards in the world, a testament to their relentless pursuit of perfection.



1898-1976 Founder Kanonkop Wine Estate

Considered the 'Father of a Cape Classic', Paul Oliver Sauer was born into Cape wine royalty as the grandson of the owner of Groot Constantia, South Africa's oldest wine estate, through his mother Mary Sauer. This legacy along with Mary's gift to him of untouched farmland, marked the beginning of Kanonkop.

In the same year he assumed ownership of Kanonkop, Paul was elected to the South African parliament. For 41 consecutive years (1929-1970), he skilfully balanced his dual commitments, advocating for amendments to liquor laws to promote quality wine production. Paul was the father of Cato and Mary, the latter who married Jannie Krige who further cemented the family's winemaking tradition.

Today, the estate's flagship Bordeaux-style blend, Paul Sauer, is named in tribute to his enduring influence on South Africa's wine industry. Sadly, Paul passed away before the iconic 1973 Cabernet

Sauvignon was released to the market.


































#### **ABRIE BEESLAAR**

**OUTGOING CELLAR MASTER & WINEMAKER** 

Abrie is considered one of the great winemakers in of his generation and a pivotal figure in the Cape's modern winemaking history. He joined Kanonkop in 2002, handpicked by his predecessor Beyers Truter to be his protégé. By 2003, Abrie had taken over as winemaker, achieving this milestone before the age of 30.

Like his predecessor, Abrie is celebrated for his expertise with Pinotage, South Africa's signature grape. His winemaking philosophy revolves around minimal intervention, allowing the vineyard's unique terroir to take center stage.

Under his leadership, Kanonkop wines have earned numerous accolades, including international recognition for the estate's iconic Pinotage and Cabernet Sauvignon. In 2018, Abrie became the first South African winemaker to score a perfect 100-point score from Tim Atkin for the Kanonkop Paul Sauer 2015. 



Pair with cakes, cookies and flavourful aged cheeses. 114. Ruffino Grappa Riserva Greppone Mazzi, IT Flavours and aromas of citrus, candied fruit and spices, leading to a smooth velvety palate. Derived from the same source as the Ruffino Brunello di Montalcino. Aged for 12 months in oak barrels. Alc 43%. Pair with cakes, cookies and flavourful aged cheeses. 115. Château d'Orignac The Cognac VSOP 'Fins Bois', FR Very fruity aromatic palate of prunes, pear, jasmine, vanilla and cinnamon. Has a soft structure and a seductive finish. Ugni Blanc, Colombard. Alc 40%. Serve at 16°-18°C as a long drink with tonic water or on the rocks. 116. Château d'Orignac The Cognac XO, FR Subtle hints of spices, leather, raisins and prunes on the nose. The mouth is perfectly balanced with a round and soft structure, bright acidity and presents a very long and distinguished finish. Ugni Blanc Colombard. Alc 40%. Taste at room temperature to end a

festive meal.





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
