As you are reading this letter I hope that you were able to enjoy the Christmas holiday and are looking forward to the beginning of another new year. In my heart, I know that this was not the reality for all of you, even so, my hope is that the new year brings you new hope for life. That's one of the things about New year's eve and day. They provide a wonderful opportunity for us to reflect on the past year, the good and the bad; and to make plans and goals for the new year. This is usually the time when the pastor is supposed to talk about New year's resolutions and how important it is to resolve to follow through on all of the spiritual practices we have been neglecting. And though I do think it is important to read scripture daily, to set a side time for study and devotionals, and to pray often; this article isn't about resolving to begin a new habit. Nor is it about giving up bad habits, at least not specifically.

I know that many use this time either to stop doing something they know they shouldn't do or to start doing something they know they should do, but this week I find those practices a little short sided in nature. The national average on American's following through with their new year's resolution after three months in incredibly low, and it gets even lower if we extend that time out to a year. And so instead of a new year's resolution that is static in nature, I am going to suggest a different mindset for 2023.

New year's resolutions are all about whether you do something or don't do something with very little wiggle room. This often leaves us with negative feelings instead of rejoicing at the progress that we have made. Let's take the individual who resolves to quit smoking as an example. They know smoking is bad for them, and the pack a day they are smoking is pretty expensive, so they make the resolution to quit. And let's say they do great and stay clean for the month of January. Then in February they have a few slip ups, and by the time March rolls around they are smoking half a pack a day. The way we look at resolutions tells us that they failed. The thing is, they didn't! They went a month and a half without smoking, and when they started smoking again they were smoking less. Were they perfect? No, but none of us are. I just think we need to celebrate whatever progress we are able to make, even if we come up short of our ultimate goals.

This is what the life of a Christian is, striving for the unattainable, working to better ourselves knowing that we will never be perfect. We know that we will never truly and fully exemplify the life of Christ in our own lives, but we do it anyway because the perfection we seek isn't really the goal. The goal is the growth we show along the journey toward that perfection, toward Christ, relying on Him throughout the journey. The scriptures encourage Christians to continue on this path of growth. Second Peter chapter three verse 18 tells us to, "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ".


And so instead of setting a resolution that is either accomplished or not, try thinking of goals that lend themselves to making progress. Think in terms of personal growth instead of final destinations. This is the approach I will be encouraging the 2023 session to take in terms of the goals of Mars UP for the coming year. It is my hope that at the end of the year we will be able to see growth in all aspects of the church's ministry. In some areas we will meet and even exceed our goals. In other areas we may come up short of our goals, but we will grow, we will learn, and at the end of the year we will be better for it. At the end of 2023 will you be able to say that you are better than you are today? Will you have spent more time with God? Will you have read a few more pages of scripture than you did last year? Will you spend time this year growing in your relationship with Jesus Christ? Let's make this year about growth! Personal growth, spiritual growth, church growth, and in all other ways; lets grow together, like the seeds planted on good soil. Because that's what we are!





## Per Capita—What is it & Why Do it???

Many have asked questions about per capita, What is it? What does it support?

The Per Capita is an important aspect of how we do church. Presbyterians are proud of how our convictions inform our church function and organizational structure. As Presbyterians, we believe in "the priesthood of all believers" and acknowledge that all are called to bring their gifts and talents to God (1 Peter 2:9). And so, we champion this idea "call" throughout all levels of our denomination. On the local church level, church members are called to serve as Elders, Deacons, and pastors. Elders and pastors of churches in geographical groupings gather as Presbyteries.

There will be a Per Capita envelope in February's envelope mailing. The cost per member is \$43.77 In a small but significant way, consider Per Capita as one way YOU and MARS UP CHURCH might be able to respond along with other Christians and churches across the nation, proclaiming the Gospel message that sin, separation and disunity will not have the final answer for us, our church, our denomination OR our world. The final answer is fully in the sovereign hands of God. Indeed, God is greater and more powerful than our broken and foolish ways of sin.

All work must be original designs!


