ORDINANCE NO. 200-2

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING TRUCK ROUTE FOR VEHICLES WEIGHING IN EXCESS OF TEN THOUSAND POUNDS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CHAPIN, MORGAN COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1: The Village Board of Trustees finds that the operation of vehicles weighing in excess of 10,000 pounds on the streets and roads within the Village of Chapin is a matter affecting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens and property of the Village of Chapin and that it is necessary to restrict the streets and roads on which such vehicles are permitted to travel within the Village.

SECTION 2: The term "vehicle" shall include any vehicle, truck, tank truck, trailer or semi-trailer propelled by mechanical, motor or muscular power, other than a railroad car on rails, weighing more than 10,000 pounds loaded or unloaded.

SECTION 3: No person, firm, partnership or corporation shall drive, cause to be driven or otherwise operate or park any vehicle, truck, tank truck, trailer or semi-trailer, weighing in excess of 10,000 pounds, including its load, on the streets, roads or alleys under the jurisdiction and control of the Village and located within the corporate limits of the Village of Chapin, except as provided for in Section 4 below.

SECTION 4: The following streets and roads within the Village of Chapin are hereby designated and established as a truck route for vehicles as defined in Section 2 above:


- a. Cooper Street from Illinois Route 104 to Superior Street;
- b. Superior Street from Cooper Street to Ash Street;
- c. Ash Street from Illinois Route 104 to Superior Street;
- d. Poplar Street from Superior Street to Chapin Street; and
- e. Railroad Street from Poplar Street to the corporate limits of the Village.
- f. Chapin Street from Poplar Street to Cooper Street; and
- g. Cooper Street from Chapin Street south to the corporate limits of the Village.

SECTION 5: The Village shall erect signs along the truck route notifying all motorists of the existence of the truck route.

SECTION 6: Any operator of a vehicle who shall violate the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined an amount not to exceed \$150.00

SECTION 7: This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication as required by law.
