I hope that you all will call from time to time — log into Caring Bridge or text me because I am an awesome texter. I hope you will check in on my "baby" and keep Audrey company. You will be in my heart while I am gone.

But, not knowing what is ahead does not mean that I am afraid or doubtful. I have confidence that God goes before us all and knows exactly what we will need before we even ask. There is no unknown to God, and I have found that for every next step that is necessary, God gets there first. We are in good hands, because God is good.

So, for every celebration, every song, every chat, every laugh, I will be turning my eyes forward, to seek what is next. I hope very much to be home by Christmas, but there is no guarantee, it all depends how I respond to treatment. Still, I look forward to returning and starting a new year of life in the family of God, First Presbyterian Church.

The Peace and Global Witness Offering is one of four annual special offerings of our Presbyterian Church (USA). This year it will take place on World Communion Sunday, **October 5, 2025**. We celebrate that we are all together at the communion table and are offered what we need to continue the work of Christ here at home and around the world.

Through participation in the Peace & Global Witness Offering, our church is extending Christ's peace throughout our community and commits to building a more just and peaceful world. We celebrate the truth found in 2nd Thessalonians, "May the God of Peace give you peace at all times in all ways." Our gifts to the Peace & Global Witness Offering are helping our neighbors in need – those who live next door, down the street, and across the globe.

25% of this offering will go to the Ministry on the Margins, a local volunteer-based ecumenical ministry that is committed to supporting those who are homeless and fall through the cracks during times of transition. They provide food, safe shelter at night and other services 7 days a week.

Presbyterian USA gives us the opportunity to support many ministries nationwide. 50% of the offering will be used to help and heal through its established programs. 25% will go to our regional Presbytery or Synod that deals with needs in our area including conflicts within the local churches.

Hospitality—Two main events in October are serving the Banquet on the 9th and Papa's Pumpkin Patch potluck lunch on the 11th.

Proclamation-Christian Education—October events will include painting pumpkins and Halloween party on Wednesdays, 22nd and 29th.

Proclamation-Worship and Music—Repairs were made to the piano.

Property and Equipment—A subcommittee, Building Task Force, has been formed consisting of:

Jim Skaret, Chair, Jay Cofell, Juanita Hocking, Becky Mahlum, Ella Gutzke, Keith Magnusson and Ron Carlisle. Session approved having the Clerk sign agreement with EAPC Architecture/Engineering firm for their review of the work needed for roof repairs-about \$35,000.
