April Reflection

Jeremiah 29:5-7 "Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat what they produce. Seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf."

Which would you rather hear first, the good news or the bad news? It's a difficult question, and I can find pros and cons for both options. I have a theory, you can challenge it all you want, but I honestly believe it is better to get the bad news first. If you hear the bad news first then the good news takes some of the sting out of it. If you hear the good news first then you are thinking oh goodness what is the bad news. Of course maybe that is just how my mind works, maybe I just want to hear the negative before the positive. I wish that it could be all good news all the time, but that is not the way it is in life, is it? Life is not all honkey-dory all the time. Our actions really do have consequences and for every bit of good news it seems like there is an equal part of bad news. Perhaps that is just the way the world balances out.

I guess the old saying is true, we would not really know how good the good news was if we did not know how bad the bad news was. Hearing the good news in conjunction with the bad news makes the good news sound better and the bad news sound not as bad, at least in my mind.

To me it seems that Israel is in a good news/bad news place in this text from Jeremiah. Israel has been invaded by Babylon, the entire tribe of Judah was taken into exile, the temple was demolished, the Ark of the Covenant is taken away, and the people are forcibly removed from their land. They are enslaved, and made to worship the god's of the Babylonians, many perish when they are walked in shackles from Judah to Babylon. To say this is bad news, is quite the understatement. It is hard to find anything redeeming about this time for the people of Israel.

In this time of desperation God puts his words on the lips of Jeremiah. You might think that in this time of fear and desperation a word of comfort might come. You would be wrong. It is a horrifyingly realistic message that God gives to the people: Thus says, the Lord, "Build houses and live in them, plant gardens, take wives, have sons and daughters, multiply."

I can say with great confidence, this is not the news that the Israelites were hoping to hear. Because essentially what Jeremiah says is, "settle in you are going to be in exile for a while, not only will you have kids, but you will have grandkids in exile." God doesn't tell the people of Israel they are coming home soon. In fact, those who were adults when they were taken captive, those who had grown up on their families land, land that had been passed down generation, after generation. Well Jeremiah tells them they are never going to see that land again, and they are going to die as strangers in a strange place.

As if this news were not already bad enough, if you were thinking there is nothing worse than the sinking knowledge that you will never see your home again, Jeremiah also says, "seek the welfare of the city where you have been sent into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf for in its welfare you will find your welfare." In other words love your enemies, love these people who have forcibly taken you away from your home, the people who burned down the temple, who killed your friends, pray for them, and do good for them.

Which would you rather hear first, the good news or the bad news? The bad news for Israel here is pretty bad, Jeremiah says, you are not coming home anytime soon, and you are to love your enemies, that surely seems like bad news. But what about the good news, where is the good news here for Israel, for us?

For so long Israel had lived under the assumption that because they were chosen, because they lived in the promise land, because they had the temple they were good they were safe. All that came crashing down with the invasion of the Babylonians, all those assumptions were thrown out of the window. Now the good news for Israel is that those assumptions were not true.

The good news is that God is not contained within a geographical location, God is not constrained by land, by sea, by sky, God is able to redeem God's people even when they are under the thumb of a vicious and ruthless enemy, stranded in a foreign land surrounded by foreign people. God's love knows no bounds, that is good news, God is in control that is good news, and God hears the cries of his people even when they are separated from all that they hold dear, even when they have spent centuries turning their back on God, God hears the cries of his people.

If you ask me, the good news in this passage far outweighs the bad news. Because the good news tells us, no matter where we are, no matter what we have done, no matter who we think that we are, God is in control, and God is faithful even when we are not, God's love does not stop when we leave the comfort of our homes, or the comfort of our church.

Of course it is important to recognize, that very same love does not promise us that we will be spared from hardship in our lives. Even Israel can be sent into exile, but no matter the hardship that appears, know this God is with you, and there isn't a single place on this earth that you can hide from the love of God. Brothers and sisters this is very good news, and it is news that has been transforming lives and communities, since Babylon.
