

SWAMI SEZ: Short, but highly competitive. The Swami lays it down for the coming season.

he Unlimited hydroplane season for 2022 will stage five races around the country as well as an exhibition and a testing day open to any current team. Gone are the days of a 10-race season. What it lacks in the amount of races will be made up by the competitive race teams that now comprise the sport. While only one boat will be champion by the end of the year, there are

now seven boats capable of pulling off a win at any time. It's a bit of a shame there are not more races to showcase this show.

Before the season even began, a four-boat exhibition took place May 20 in Vancouver, Wash., on the Columbia River. Four boats took to the water just one at time to lay down some test runs and get the fans excited. The *Miss Beacon Plumbing* undoubtedly had the best showing. This city also hosted a previous exhibition in 1979. Maybe there will be a race in the future?

The five races start with the biggest one of them all: the Gold Cup, which this year will be held at Guntersville, Alabama, on beautiful Lake Guntersville, June 25–26. It marks the first time this city has hosted boat racing's biggest

and most prestigious event. That will be followed by the traditional stop in the small town that's steeped in boat racing history: Madison, Indiana, on July 1–3. From there it's the northwest swing in Washington state with stops in Tri-Cities July 29–31 and a return to Seattle after two years on August 5–7. After a bit of a break, the teams stay on the West Coast with the season ending finale in San Diego, California, September 16–18.

Even with the seven aforementioned teams capable of winning a race, the season championship will come down to just two, the U-1 *Miss HomeStreet* driven by Jimmy Shane and the U-8 *Miss Tri-Cities* driven by the 2021 driver champion J. Michael Kelly. *HomeStreet* will most likely come out of the blocks fast and edge out

the *Miss Tri-Cities* at the Gold Cup and the points race will go back and forth after that all the way until the season finale. It should go all the way down to final at that last race.

But let's not totally count out the remainder of the top boats that will be right on the heels of these two. The second boat from Strong Racing, the U-9 *Pinnacle Peak Consulting* driven by Corey Peabody, won the Columbia Cup in 2021 and will be right there if either of the top two falter. The same can be said for U-12 *Graham Trucking* driven by hard charger Andrew Tate and the second team from Madison the U-91 *Goodman Real Estate* with Jeff Bernard, who has wins to his credit in the Unlimiteds.

And oh, let's not count out the alltime winningest driver Dave Villwock, who will be piloting Kelly Stocklin's *Miss Beacon Plumbing*, which looks plenty fast in the preseason. Another team with a shot at winning would be Jamie Nilsen whose U-11 from the Unlimited Racing Group showed a vast improvement in speed at times in 2021.

Rounding out the field are the fan favorite and only piston boat on the circuit, the U-3 *Griggs Ace Hardware*, which will be driven by Jimmy King in its expected two race appearances and a two-, maybe three-race season by the U-21 to be driven by Brian Perkins.

As always, the season will consist of

spectacular heat races, breakage followed by hard work and long hours, a few upsets, plenty of heartbreak, and finally a champion will be crowned in Southern California in September. With few races, and no room for error it's going to be a wild ride. So, buckle up.

1) U-1 Miss Homestreet

2) U-8 Miss Tri-Cities

SWAMI SEZ: This team is strong enough to not fall prey to the sophomore season slump. Now in its second year, the team came through in its first season with driver Kelly winning the driving championship. Expect this boat to be in all five final heats, winning two of them.

3) U-40 Miss Beacon Plumbing

SWAMI SEZ: Much off-season work should make this boat even better than last year. With the all-time leader in race victories doing the driving, the threat to win is there at every race. Recent test in at the Vancouver exhibition showed some dramatic speed and smoothness

first time out. If things align, this team could have a championship.

SWAMI SEZ: As always, Rob Graham will be fielding a top-flight team with an aggressive driver and should make all final heats as well as many wins in the prelims. It was odd not to see Tate victorious in any of the races in 2021, so look for them to grab at least one win.

6) U-91 Goodman Real Estate

SWAMI SEZ: Second boat for the Indiana team will be a strong runner. By strong it means capable of victory in the prelims or in the final heat at any time. This is the season dark horse that could break through at any race. A good showing at the Vancouver exhibition exposed a few easily fixable issues and will be in top form for the first race.

Traveler's guide to the Tri-Cities.

ith the 2022 season schedule set, all are hoping everything will come off this year without a COVID hitch! For fans heading to testing in the Tri-Cities or to the HAPO Columbia Cup, here's a spotlight on that race and on Richland, Kennewick, and Pasco.

The Tri-City Water Follies announced that Mark Williams has been hired to replace retiring event director Kathy Powell. Although Powell had hoped to retire before this year's race, she agreed to stay on until her replacement was hired. She will work together with Williams to carry out the 2022 HAPO Columbia Cup.

Williams has event experience and has been associated with the Water Follies, as the firm he previously worked for handled security for the Tri-City race. He is from Spokane, although his former employer is based in Texas. Powell reports that the 2022 event is scheduled to be like pre-pandemic races, and most popular special area tickets are back, such as Hydro Hot Spot, Round Table, and the Bulldog Beach Club. Telephone orders are accepted.

Lots of fans from Western Washington head to Eastern Washington for Tri-City spring testing in June and for the HAPO Columbia Cup race in July. We are living in unusual times, so here's a tip for those driving from the west side to the east side:

If gas is needed, likely the least expensive places to buy fuel are off the Cle Elum exit at Warrior's Shell directly on the north side of the street off the Cle Elum exit, or at Shree's off the Thorp exit (near Ellensburg), next to Thorp Fruit and Antiques.

Most lodging chains are in Richland, Kennewick, or Pasco and many new hotels have been built in the past few years. Please note that the Economy Inn, the Days Inn, and the former Best Western Plus Columbia River Hotel (formerly Clarion, formerly Richland Tower) in Richland, are closed as the properties will be redeveloped.

The popular Shilo Inn, now called the Riverfront Hotel-SureStay Collection by Best Western, is open, but the property has been for sale, so confirm it is open. The Clover Island Inn in Kennewick is open but has also been for sale. It is popular with hydro fans as it is walking distance to the hydro pits. For fans going to the Tri-Cities for the first time and staying overnight, all three cities— Kennewick, Richland and Pasco—are convenient to the racecourse.

Many chain restaurants are in the Tri-Cities, but here are a few, non-chain options, popular with local residents:

For fine dining in Richland, check out Drumheller's at the Lodge at Columbia Point, Bookwalter Winery, or Dovetail Joint. Casual places to eat include Pacific Pasta and Grill, Lu Lu Craft Bar + Kitchen, Casa Mia (for pizza in Richland and Kennewick), and Family Garden (for Chinese food.)

White Bluffs Brewing, Iconic Brewing, and Atomic Ale have great local brews. Technically in Richland, but a little bit out of town, is the Goose Ridge Winery (and ciders) with a fun tasting room, light food, and often live music on Saturdays.

Tumbleweeds is great for Tex/Mex take-out food. In Pasco, Magill's is a great local spot, especially for breakfast; you won't go away hungry. In Kennewick, The CG Public House is a popular, casual place. Moonshot Brewing is great for local beer and the Fast and Curryous food truck is generally there Friday evenings until 7:30 pm.

Europa Italian & Spanish Cuisine is a great choice for dinner. Authentic Filipino food can be found at the casual, but ultra-modern, Dagupan Grill. Breakfast, lunch, and pie are offered at super casual, Just Joel's, a mainstay holein-the-wall in Kennewick.

These are just a few of the great local spots.

And don't forget that Friday (9 a.m. to 8 p.m.) and Saturday (9 a.m. to 7 p.m.) of HAPO Cup race weekend, there is the big Art in the Park arts and crafts show at Howard Aman Park, on the Columbia River in Richland. Lots of vendors and the local rod and gun club serves up a pretty good BBQ salmon and cole slaw dinner, too.

Other Notes: The UNJ would like to give a shout out to Bill and Dee Moore. They are fans and good friends of the UNJ and unlimited hydroplane racing. Bill and Dee stepped up and their company, May Awning and Patio, were both the presenting sponsor for the Vancouver exhibition and sponsored the U-11 for their Vancouver appearance. Thank you! �

COMMENTS FROM H1 Jan Shaw, Director of Operations



The 2022 H1 Unlimited racing season has nearly arrived. We've had one exhibition event, another test session is coming very soon, and the season will get underway later this month with the Gold Cup in Guntersville, Alabama.

The exhibition in Vancouver, Washington, was a great success. As with all first-time events, there were hiccups along the way. We weren't able to get the boats on the Columbia River as quickly as we hoped and other complications popped up that got in the way, but thanks to the efforts of race chair Nelson Holmberg and the volunteers that he organized, they showed Vancouver to be a viable site for unlimited hydroplane racing.

The promoters of the event, Visit Vancouver, also seemed delighted with the result. Their goal is to make Vancouver a stop on the regular H1 Unlimited Racing Series, and they made an excellent case for just that to happen in the not-too-distant future. A good crowd of people attended and there was frontpage coverage in the local newspaper.

The race committee also was happy with how it turned out. They will freely admit that they have some details to work out about holding an unlimited event, but learning those things is the whole point of holding an exhibition. They'll be more than ready when it comes time to run a real race.

Another group of boats will test on the Columbia River again on Friday, June 3, but this time will be about 230 miles upstream from Vancouver at the Tri-Cities, Washington. Then, the boats will be ready for racing. The 2022 season will start June 25 and 26 with the Gold Cup in Guntersville, and will continue with events at Madison, Indiana, on July 1 to 3, the Tri-Cities on July 29 to 31, Seattle on August 5 to 7, and San Diego on September 16 to 18.

H1 will try something new at some of the races this summer. The sport's board of directors has approved a new race format that will be tested as a semi-feature event on Saturday at some race sites. Showdown, the

event will feature a series of two-boat match races of two laps each then a final heat of three laps to determine the winner. The match-race pairings will be determined by qualifying speed, with the slower of the two boats starting from the inside lane.

Points toward the national title will be earned by the competitors in the Showdown event and, if enough race sites hold the match-races, there may be separate recognition at the end of the year for the boats that have performed the best during these Saturday semi-feature events.

The Saturday Showdown events are intended to provide fans with something new on the race schedule that will offer them nearly continuous action on the water. As for the regular race, if a race site chooses to run a Showdown event on Saturday, it would not hold preliminary heats that day. Instead, the entire race, two sets of preliminary heats and the winner-take-all final will happen on Sunday. \diamondsuit
