Ribbons in each class will be awarded: blue, red, white, green and best of class, and best of show will be awarded. 8. No exhibit or award may be removed before Thursday, March 20, 2025 before 3:00 p.m. Exhibit pick-up will be Thursday, March 20th from 3:00 5:00 p.m.
