8. No exhibit or award may be removed before Thursday, March 20, 2025 before 3:00 p.m. Exhibit pick-up will be Thursday, March 20th from 3:00 – 5:00 p.m.
9. We will not be accountable for exhibits left after 5:00p.m., March 20, 2025
