BCAH Named as Nonprofit Organization of the Year

According to the speech delivered by President Pat Monacelli of the Broomfield Area Chamber of Commerce at the Chamber's Annual Event, the Broomfield Council on the Arts & Humanities (BCAH) received many nominations from the community to be honored with the recognition of the 2024 Business Excellence Award of "Nonprofit Organization of the Year." Keri Dillingham, BCAH Executive Director, and Kathy Klatt, BCAH Board of Directors President, gratefully accepted this award on behalf of the nonprofit.



This is the second time in BCAH's history that it has been given this distinguished designation. In 2019, Keri Dillingham and Chippy Cianci, current BCAH Vice President, were present to receive the award.

Due to the Chamber's expert networking, this year's awardees also each received a "Certificate of Special Congressional Recognition" signed by U.S. Representative Brittany Pettersen.

Awards from the Chamber are highly prized designations by local businesses and nonprofits as the Chamber is the source of connection, advancement, advocacy, and support for the Broomfield business community. The Chamber serves as a bridge between for-profit businesses and nonprofit organizations by providing a connection that allows businesses to demonstrate their civic engagement and community investment by collaborating with nonprofit organizations through sponsorships, volunteering, and in-kind donations.

On January 18, all classes (Kindergarten through 5th grade) at Coyote Ridge Elementary School (an Adams 12 Five Star school in Broomfield) experienced the joy of in-person storytelling!



Janis Lievens, Broomfield Spellbinders' School Liaison, worked with Principal Michael Keppler and Secretary Caroline Bullock to create a schedule that allowed students in all 18 classrooms (three at each grade level) to participate in a 20-minute storytelling session. Fourteen Broomfield Spellbinders took part in this effort. Our goal was to let each teacher see firsthand the power of oral storytelling and encourage them to make such visits a regular part of their students' educational experience.

This season, we are thrilled to bring to life Dan Forrest's *Jubilate Deo*. *Jubilate Deo* brings to life the global aspect of the traditional Psalm 100 text, "O be joyful in the Lord, all ye lands," by setting it in seven different languages and drawing from a wide spectrum of musical influences. Each movement combines some characteristics of its language-group's musical culture with the composer's own musical language. Movements include liturgical Latin, intertwined Hebrew and Arabic, Mandarin Chinese, Zulu, Spanish, Song of the Earth (untexted), and a closing movement combining several of these languages with English. The result is a stunning global celebration of joy, as all the earth sings as one, "omnis terra, jubilate!"

Each show displays hundreds of artwork entries from local students which are unveiled during an evening reception and continue to be on display for daytime gallery hours for the enjoyment of the community.

Broomfield Recreation Services and Broomfield Council on the Arts & Humanities (BCAH) continue to partner on these events with local school art teachers to support youth creativity and creative education. A significant benefit of this annual show is to the students in grades K-12 who have the memorable experience of participating in a gallery show.

Additionally, entertainment is provided by youth pianists who won awards and recognition in the Broomfield Music Teachers Association's Annual Broomfield Piano Festival. They benefit from playing for the large gallery crowd in attendance on opening night. Each year, BCAH's provides the award to BMTA for the winner of the senior division. This year, there was a tie for 1st place. To avoid the winners having to split the award money, BCAH provided two \$300 awards.

Finding Fossil Mammals in the Arctic

**Broomfield Crescent Grange Lecture Series Presents
Finding Fossil Mammals in the Arctic**

Join us for a night of intelligent conversation with Jaelyn Eberle, Ph.D. Dr. Eberle's talk will focus on her research on ancient mammals that inhabited the Arctic during the early Eocene Epoch (ca. 52 – 54 million years ago) as well as on tiny mammals that lived alongside the dinosaurs in northern Alaska during the Late Cretaceous Period (ca. 72 million years ago). Wine and snacks provided. Gift basket drawing at the end of presentation for \$5 per ticket.

Dr. Eberle is a vertebrate paleontologist originally from Saskatchewan, Canada. She is Director of the Museum & Field Studies (MFS) Program, Curator of Fossil Vertebrates at the University of Colorado Museum of Natural History, and a professor in the Department of Geological Sciences at CU-Boulder. Jaelyn's research focuses on the study of mammalian faunas during past intervals of climate change as well as the recovery and evolution of mammals following the mass extinction at the Cretaceous-Paleogene boundary that wiped out the non-avian dinosaurs. Jaelyn's field research on fossil mammals takes her all over the Rocky Mountain Region as well as to the North Slope of Alaska and Canada's High Arctic.

What is your artistic style?

I am an explorational abstract artist, emphasizing texture and dimension using mixed media and acrylics on canvas.

Why do you make art?

I make art as a spiritual practice. I go to the studio because I want to know more deeply the truth of life and love, and everything that relates to it. I want to know more clearly who I am and what my purpose is. I want to love more purely myself and others, my creator, and this creation. Making art nurtures and guides me along this path. I do not see myself as an art business. I create "original-one of a kind" paintings that help me learn and then I want to share them with others.

What inspires you?

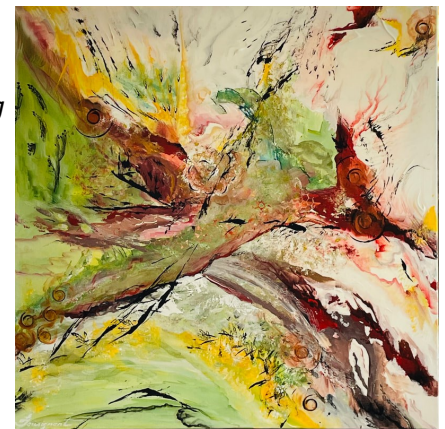
Music inspires me. Listening to music with my eyes closed, I see in my mind's eye ethereal images gently, beautifully moving, yes, dancing to the rhythm of the music. It's as if my soul is dancing.

I am inspired when I am in nature. Time outside helps the limiting patterns of my thinking release and fall away. I can take a short walk in the woods or my neighborhood and am amazed at the inspiration that pours into me as I step to the rhythm of my breath. Once my mind has become still, everywhere I turn, I observe lines and textures that nature has created. Rocks, plants, and bugs inspire. The way water intensifies colors inspires. The way plant life moves in gently flowing water; the leaves of a tree flutter in a gentle breeze; the clouds moving along, changing shapes up in the sky...all these inspire me. I am mesmerized by the way nature dances and I bring its movements and feelings into my paintings.

More recently, I have become enthralled by the idea of "waking things up" that have been resting in my art and craft supply. I love adding beads, threads, broken jewelry and anything "bling" into my art. It's fun for me to see things take on a new way of expression. I think the subtle and brief reflection of light off objects in my paintings is much like life's joyful moments. They are often just for a brief moment, but if looked again from another angle or in a different light, one can catch another glimpse.

I deeply desire to use my art as a way to serve. Every piece I create is held in light and love for good. I hold whoever might be inspired by my art in light and love.

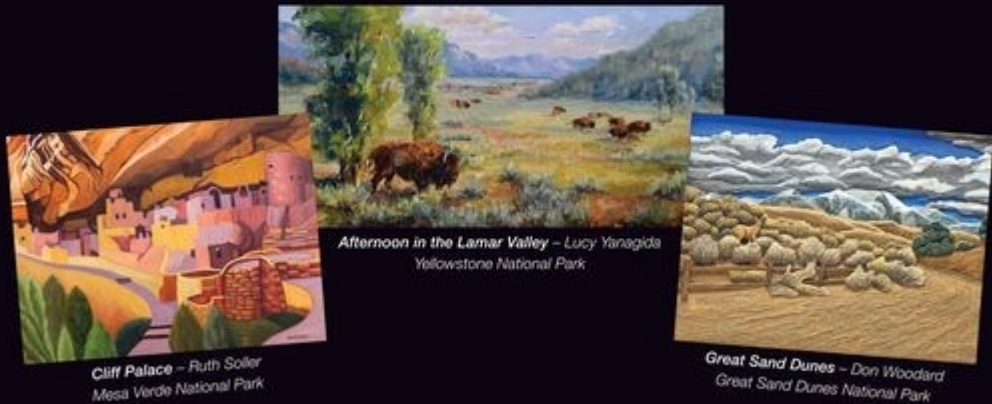
