

INSURANCE SERVICES OFFICE PUBLIC PROTECTION CLASSIFICATION 04/10 EFFECTIVE 2/1/2022



February 3, 2022

On October 25, 2021 the Monroe Fire Protection District received an updated Public Protection Classification (PPC) from the Insurance Services Office (ISO). In this update the MFPD is recognized for its water shuttle capabilities and the split class has been removed from the rating. Effective February 1, 2022 any address within five road miles of a responding fire station will receive the District's 04 rating.

A responding fire station means the nearest fire station that is automatically dispatched to the property. This could be a Monroe Fire Protection District fire station or a fire station from a fire department with an automatic mutual aid agreement with the District.

Previously, an address within five miles of a responding fire station was also required to be within 1,000 feet of a fire hydrant to receive the 04 rating. Addresses outside of 1,000 feet of a hydrant were rated at 09. The District's new ISO rating could mean substantial savings for property owners on homeowners' insurance.

A property not within five road miles of the responding fire station is classified as a (10) without an adequate water supply within 1,000 feet and (10W) if within 1,000 feet of an adequate water supply.

As of January 1, 2022, Benton, Bloomington, Clear Creek, Indian Creek, Perry, Van Buren and Washington township are officially in the District. Polk and Salt Creek townships contract with the District. Maps illustrating five road miles from each MFPD fire station are located at <u>https://www.monroefd.org/iso-rating.html</u>
