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# Secular Humanism and the Bible


## Sometimes They Agree, Sometimes They Oppose

The thing you have to remember about science is that there is nothing wrong with it and it can be very helpful to us *if it is used the right way.* Let me go back to my original





explanation. When a Christian refers to the baby in the womb it is considered a *separate life*, even if it is no bigger than your thumb.
