



STATE OF NEVADA TO CREATE THE RADIATION THERAPY AND RADIOLOGIC IMAGING ADVISORY COMMITTEE

**Have you ever thought about serving on a State Advisory Board?
If so, here is an opportunity to represent the profession and our patients.**

The Committee consists of seven members, all of whom are voting members, appointed by the Governor. The Governor shall ensure that the members of the Committee represent the geographic diversity of this State.

The Governor shall appoint to the Committee:

- a. One member who holds a license and is certified by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists, or its successor organization, to practice in the area of radiography.
- b. One member who holds a license and is certified by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists, or its successor organization, to practice in the area of nuclear medicine technology.
- c. One member who holds a license and is certified by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists, or its successor organization, to practice in the area of radiation therapy.
- d. One member who holds a limited license.
- e. One member who is a physician specializing in radiology.
- f. One member who is a physician specializing in an area other than radiology, or a dentist, chiropractor or podiatrist.
- g. One member who is certified to provide clinical professional services in a field of medical physics.

The Radiation Therapy and Radiologic Imaging Advisory Committee was created by the passage of SB130. The Committee's charge is to:

- Recommend to the Board of Health a national professional organization against which the scope of practice of radiation technician licensees will be measured; and
- Make such other recommendations to the Board, the Division of Public and Behavioral Health and the Legislature concerning radiation therapy and radiologic imaging as it deems proper.
