## PIGEON PIONEER PASSES AWAY AFTER LONG ILLNESS

Daniel Fisher, 87, one of the first business men in Pigeon, died at his home in this village Friday afternoon. Mr. Fisher had been failing for about four or five years. For the past year he was unable to leave his home.

Daniel Fisher was born at Zurich, Ontario, on February 14, 1855. When a young man he settled in the Canadian Northwest for a short time, coming to Pigeon about fifty years ago, to enter the blacksmith business which he continued until about twelve or fifteen years ago, when on account of ill health he retired.

He leaves his widow; three sons, Edward, at home, Wilbur in the U.S. navy; Ernest at Elkhart, Ind.; one daughter, Mrs. Beatrice Woehlert of Lenox, Mich., and ten grandchildren; two brothers and three sisters in Canada.

The funeral service was conducted at the home Sunday afternoon by Rev. Sumner Young. Services at the grave were conducted by the Masonic fraternity of which he held a life membership. Burial was in the Pigeon cemetery.
