

NVQ JULY BOM – PATRIOTIC STAR



Fabric Requirements: Cream Background A: Cut 4 3 ½" squares. Cream Background B: Cut 1 4 ¼" Square. Blue C: Cut 2 4 ¼" squares. Red D: Cut 1 4 ¼" Square. Red Plaid E: Cut 1 3 ½" Square

Place 1 Blue C 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square and 1 background cream 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square face to face. Draw a line diagonally corner to corner. Stitch $\frac{1}{2}$ on each side of the line. Cut on line. You now have 2 square triangles. Press to blue side. Do the same with the other Blue C 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square and Red D 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

Take one blue +background square and one blue + red square face to face, blues opposite. Draw a line diagonally across seam line corner to corner. Stitch ¼" on each side and cut on line. Repeat. You will end up with 4 quarter square triangle segments. Square to 3 ½".

Lay out as in diagram. Sew together.
