From Pastor Bill's Study

Greetings to all,

Recently I and a few others attended a seminar dealing with the leadership of the church. The seminar was both informative and challenging at the same time. The information that was shared dealt with the way that churches deal with the Board and the selection of officers needed to run the church.

The idea of a minimum structure to lead the church is not new but the idea of the accountability of the Board has been added to the plan. The accountability is to Christ and to what goals for the year the church has set.

For many years there have been goals set by the pastor and the Board but nothing has changed because there was not any true plan to achieve those goals. The new plan of leadership is one of accountability not only for the pastor but it also involves the Leadership team but also everyone within the church.

My plan is to have a new system in place by January 01, 2019 so that we as a church will be able to start on a new path fulfilling our mission of making new disciples and our vision of "Changing the church to Change the world."

For that plan to take place a lot is going to have to happen within a short few months. I will need your help to make this work. First the church has to be behind the idea of changing the way we are doing things so that we can have a different result. The evidence of what has been taking place is clear and does not have a good future projected for Milton Bethany if change does not take place. The changes I am talking about are not radical but will have radical results if they are followed and the church is behind these changes.

I think the first thing that needs to take place is we need to nominate and elect leaders who will lead! By this I mean if you are asked to be a part of this structure of leadership then there will be certain parameters that will need to be in place. We must lead not just with our words but also with our action. Those chosen for leadership should be able to be accountable to certain standards of attendance in worship and the meetings, Spiritual growth through Biblical studies and personal devotions.

For this new idea to grow we will need twelve people who will commit three years to implement and sustain the growth of these ideas and the church as Christ envisioned it to be.

On the plus side this way of doing things should reduce the number of meetings per month and should make the meeting more productive. The waste of time and unproductive motions should also be reduced.

For the next few months there will be training and readings that will be presented for the purpose of education and exploitation of what will be undertaken by the leadership team as we know it.

I will be ordering the materials within the next few weeks and ask for your commitment to read and discuss these materials so that we will be ready to move into the new year with a new resolve to make Bethany a resurrected church with a clear purpose and plan to make new disciples for Christ. If anyone would like to start reading a head the books being used will be "*Mission Possible*" by Kay Kotan and "*Winning on Purpose*" by John Edward Kaiser. Both books are available in written form or as e-books on Kindle. Please let me know if you need one and what format you would like.

If you have an interest in seeing Bethany church being sustainable into the future then please pray and commit to being a part of this new form of leadership. Be ready to answer the question presented by Christ when asked "What have you done for my church?"

I pray we might all be ready to answer that we have put ourselves second and have made making new disciple for Him first in our lives.

New Ministry (Ed Health Kits) Update:

Bethany is proud and excited to announce we are launching a personal hygiene packs ministry for members of our community! This will be an ongoing ministry and collection of materials will continue to be placed in the bins in the sanctuary. There will be events held at the church on tables that will be set up and individuals will be able to select from the items available for their own needs. (Date yet to be determined for this event). Also selected items to be bagged to send to HandUp's "Renewed Hope Women's Home" (A date and time to be set to assemble these kits to take to HandUp yet to be determined.)

The items that we are accepting for the packs are:

Soap, shower gel, shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, body sprays, toothpaste, toothbrushes, hand/body lotion, wash cloths, hand towels, disposable personal/baby wipes, feminine products, toilet paper, and both baby and adult diapers. The small individual, hotel-sized bottles are preferred but any donations are welcomed!

Lay Leader's Report

The Bethany effort on behalf of the Milton Panther Packs program continues to be strong. On July 16 we took 480 fruit cups and 398 individual cereal boxes to St. Andrew's, which more than met our promised quota for June and for that far into July.

Bethany also showed its compassion by donating 211.00 to the Water for Tanzania campaign that the local Lutheran Parish ran in July in connection with VBS. This amount was matched out of the endowment funds of Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church, thereby doubling the total to 422.00.

As the summer Bible study on the Book of James came to an end, all the participants gave thanks to Pastor Bill for his astute leadership and his dedication to furthering our Christian insight. James' epistle is so thought-provoking and so applicable to our lives today that we pause to wonder how many other such riches await us in other in-depth studies of this same nature.

Leadership (Ad Board) Report....

We are pleased to state that Bethany's apportionments to Conference have been paid through August 2018. Significant money was made for the church over the first two-thirds of the calendar year by taking advantage of the permissible chance to stagger payments and letting the money grow in investments in the meantime. The rest of the year's apportionments obligation will be met at the end of 2018, so that we can realize similar growth over that four-month period as well. When all is said and done, we will have completed another year of 100 percent payment of apportionments and done it in the most efficacious way possible.

The church's QuickBooks accounting system is ready to be registered on the office desktop computer that has been dedicated solely to the use of the Treasurer. Once that happens, all Bethany financial files will be transferred to that device, and time conflicts on office equipment will be things of the past.

Pastor Bill announces that this year's Lewisburg District Church Conference will be held at St. Andrew's at 2:00 PM on Sunday, November 4. At that meeting we will declare our accomplishments for 2018 and make known our 2019 governance structure, goals, and plans.

We will be producing flyers for you to take to distribute/hang up to get the word out to the community. St. Andrew's has already reached out to us to donate blankets to be given at this event. We are accepting new or gently-used coats, hats, scarves, gloves, warm clothing, blankets, and shoes. If you find yourself cleaning out your closets, please bring them to the church or the office. We always have a great need for children's items. If you prefer to make a monetary donation, please see Shelly or Pastor Bill. Thank you in advance for your support of this important mission for the community.

4) VBS Mission Project update

The total amount we collected between the 3 churches and the children for the VBS Mission project, Water for Tanzania all together was \$503.36. Christ Evangelical Lutheran's endowment committee & Council approved a matching donation, so the total amount being sent in will be \$1,006.72. What a great representation of God's work through this mission!!!

5) Movie Night

Our first Movie Night's showing of "I Can Only Imagine' was well very much attended! Thanks to everyone who came out, to Dave & Joan Warburton for lending us the movie to screen and to Pastor Bill & Janet for the yummy popcorn! We are planning on scheduling these regularly. If there is a movie you'd like us to show, please let Pastor Bill or Shelly know!

6) Community Dinner

On August 12th, Bethany provided hamburgers and hot dogs for the Community Dinner which served 140 guests plus about 20 volunteers. Thanks as always to "Grill Master Mike" Longenberger for working his usual flame-broiled deliciousness magic! The next meal will be held on October 14th for which Bethany is responsible for garlic bread. The Planning meeting for this is one will be held on Thursday, Oct. 4th at Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church at 6:30 PM for those who would like to attend.

7) <u>Hygiene Kits</u> – There is still discussion as to a name for this ministry but for now it is called "Ed Health Kits" Please see the update information on Page 4 for how we plan on distributing these ongoing kits.
