- Willingness and ability to learn new systems, processes, and reporting requirements

- Experience with or interest in data tracking, analytics, and quality improvement
- Microsoft Excel knowledge (data entry, basic formulas, tracking spreadsheets)
- Strong organizational, communication, and time-management skills
