Daniel Richard Abbe age 87, of Oliver Twp., Elkton died Tuesday evening, September 16, at the Huron County Medical Facility, Bad Axe. He was born November 22, 1926, at the home of his parents, the late Jacob and Rose (Pincombe) Abbe in Oliver Twp. and has lived in Oliver Twp. his whole life.



Dan served in the US Army during WW II, when he returned home, he worked on the family farm. On December 7, 1946, he was united in marriage to Rose Rinnert at her pastor's home in Grant Twp.
