[Trump Admin Orders More Access to Federal Lands for Hunters \(Guns.com\)](#)

U.S. Secretary of the Interior Doug Burgum recently issued an order to help remove unnecessary barriers to hunting and fishing on public lands.

The seven-page order, SO 3447, recognizes that "Hunting and fishing are foundational components of the Nation's conservation tradition." In a salute to that, it details all bureaus and offices under the Interior Department to, "Identify and remove unnecessary regulatory or administrative barriers to hunting and fishing on Department-managed lands and waters," and expand access and opportunities where "compatible with law, refuge purposes, park enabling statutes, reclamation area requirements, safety, and conservation needs."

The order also does not restrict the use of traditional (lead) ammo on these public lands.


Burgum, the 55th Interior Secretary, is the former Republican governor of North Dakota and was confirmed by the U.S. Senate in a 79-18 vote for his position last year. As governor, he approved numerous pro-2A bills, including one for permitless carry. Soon after taking up his current office at Interior, he moved to open 87,000 acres of public land managed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to hunting and fishing.



NRA Armed Citizen from January 2026 Magazine

During the night of Jan. 2, a resident heard what sounded like someone pounding on their front door in Newport, Ore. When they investigated, they saw one man repeatedly stabbing another on the front porch.

They attempted to intervene, but the assailant continued the attack, so the resident shot the assailant once, killing him. The stabbing victim was transported to the hospital in critical condition from multiple stab wounds. This attack appeared to be random, as there was no indication the 42-year-old assailant knew the 33-year-old victim or the home's resident.

Police found an ID belonging to another man in the assailant's possession, however, so they performed a welfare check for the ID holder. Receiving no response, they entered his location and found that 58-year-old man dead of multiple stab wounds. This victim was a known associate of the assailant.

[Zero Dollar Tax NFA Stamp Woes: ATF e-Forms Swamped with 150,000 Submissions on Day 1](#)

With the National Firearms Act tax on short-barreled firearms and suppressors zeroed out effective Jan. 1, 2026, the ATF was swamped with submissions.

A byproduct of July 2025's One Big Beautiful Bill – which originally included both the language of the Hearing Protection Act and the SHORT Act, which would have deregulated the popular devices – the tax reduction took effect on New Year's Day. Despite being a holiday, gun owners and FFLs quickly moved to upload some 150,000 new e-Forms requests, compared to a typical daily volume of around 2,500.

This came amid system outages as dealers who had stacked up factory SBRs and suppressors on layaway programs over the past few months submitted Form 4 transfer requests in mass, while individuals eager to make a new NFA item on a "free" Form 1 did the same. The industry had unsuccessfully sought forbearance on tax collection during the seven months from when the OBBB was signed to when the tax actually dropped. The ATF took the eForms system offline for the last week of 2025 to prepare for the change.

[DOJ Declares Federal Ban on Mailing Handguns Unconstitutional in Landmark Opinion](#)

On Thursday, the Department of Justice's Office of Legal Counsel (OLC), led by Assistant Attorney General T. Elliot Gaiser, issued a groundbreaking memorandum opinion concluding that 18 U.S.C. § 1715, the nearly century-old federal statute prohibiting the mailing of concealable firearms, is unconstitutional as applied to constitutionally protected arms, such as handguns. This opinion marks a significant application of the Supreme Court's 2022 decision in *New York State Rifle & Pistol Association v. Bruen*, extending Second Amendment protections to the shipment of firearms via the U.S. Postal Service.

As of January 2026, the law remains on the books, but the DOJ's non-enforcement shifts practical reality. Congress could repeal or amend § 1715 (as proposed in bills like H.R. 3033), or courts may weigh in via Shreve. For now, this OLC opinion, binding within the executive, signals a bold executive reinterpretation of gun rights in the Bruen era.
