

Clifford Township Supervisors Meeting June 11, 2019

Supervisors Present: Barry Searle, Chris Marcho

Business meeting held on Tuesday, June 11, 2019. Vice Chairman Barry Searle called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Motion to approve the minutes by Mr. Marcho, second by Mr. Searle. All in favor. Treasurer's report reviewed and will be put on file. List of bills reviewed. Mr. Searle made a motion to pay all bills, except for Clifford Home and Auto which will be reviewed at the next township meeting when Mr. Knowlton is present. Second by Mr. Marcho. All in favor.

Old Business: A letter from the township requesting State Police coverage of SR 106 in order to impede speeding was read and signed.

No bids were received for the Community Road Paving Project. Approval to re-advertise for next month.

Mr. Marcho made a motion to sign a contract with Bassett Engineering Inc. to begin work on bridges on Tinkerbrook Road and Welsh Hill Road. Cost estimated at approximately \$200,000. Second by Mr. Searle. All in favor.

Mr. Marcho also made a motion to sign a contract with Bassett Engineering Inc. to work on permitting needed for the proposed pedestrian park stream bridge Cost estimated at approximately \$18,000. Second by Mr. Searle. All in favor.

The Salvation Army donation bin has been well received and will stay in place.

Mr. Marcho will start research on installing a shower in the community center to move forward in having the building becoming a Red Cross Shelter/Warming Station.

Thank you notes from the Susquehanna County Conservation District and the Mountain View Garden Club were read.

New Business: PennDOT has postponed the closing of SR 106 until next year due to permitting delays. Mr. Searle requested Solicitor McGraw construct a letter to be written reflecting the urgency and dangers of the delay to be sent to Senator Lisa Baker and State Representatives.

Devin Pryor from Nextera Energy and Justin Kastner from CanAcre came in to discuss their continued intent to erect five wind turbines in Clifford. Permits have not yet been sought. They are looking to be running by the spring of 2021.

Mr. Marcho informed that an ADA compliant sidewalk is going to be added to the park and a concrete apron is to be poured at the garage.

Sandy Wilmot is donating a hand-made quilt of the township's logo to be put on display in the community center. She requested a protective box be made for it to be protected.
