Q1: What can Cosmetic Dentistry do for me?

A: Cosmetic Dentistry can enhance the health and beauty of your smile and mouth. To achieve the highest level of aesthetics it is of utmost importance to make sure your gums and supporting bone are healthy. It is also important to make sure there is no decay in your teeth. Once a solid foundation has been achieved then beautiful restorations such as veneers and all ceramic crowns and inlays can be placed. Using these restorations will give the patient a more beautiful and youthful smile, literally taking years off their appearance.

Q2: What is the difference between a Cosmetic Dentist & General Dentist?

A: The key difference between a Cosmetic Dentist and General Dentist is the level of training, experience and focus of the doctors practice. In cosmetic dentistry we focus on restoring a worn and broken down dentition.

We rebuild and enhance peoples smiles with full mouth reconstruction, implants, veneers, whitening and all ceramic restorations to make sure there's a harmony between form, function and beauty. A general dentist may not have the level of training to do larger more complicated cases and generally will perform as many of the sub-specialties themselves as they feel comfortable with.

Q3: Are Veneers fake teeth?

A veneer by definition is a thin layer of material applied to another material to give a pleasing appearance. You do not replace the tooth. A porcelain veneer is bonded to the front of a natural tooth. The veneer can be as thin as a contact lens, but when bonded to the front of a tooth, it becomes as strong as the natural tooth. Veneers can have a dramatic affect on your overall look.
