Wisdom From Afar....

Ritual Scholar Suzan

Tisha B'Av (Hebrew: תשעה באב ט, "The Ninth of Av") is an annual fast day in Judaism, named for the ninth day (Tisha) of the month of Av in the Hebrew calendar. The fast commemorates the destruction of both the First Temple

and Second Temple in Jerusalem, which occurred about 655 years apart, but on the same Hebrew calendar date. But other calamities have also befallen the Jewish people on or near this date, including the expulsion of all Jews from England in 1290 and the start of World War I. *Tisha B'Av* also has become a day to commemorate many other tragedies that have befallen the Jewish people, including the Crusades, the pogroms, and the Holocaust. In other words, it has become known as a day of really bad luck for Jews.

Any one of these events could have posed an exist-

ential threat to the Jewish community, that is, Jews and Judaism as we know it could have been wiped out. But as I reflect on the course of Jewish history, I wonder if it's because of all these calamities that we are still here as a distinct people among the nations. The destruction of the First and Second Temples led to remaining remnants of the people to be scattered far and wide, and many were lost through assimilation. But a core was able to maintain their identity as Jews and learn the important lesson on how to live among other people who were often hostile to their very existence.

The destruction of the Second Temple, in particular, led to the rise of rabbinic Judaism with its focus on prayer, good deeds, and adherence to the laws and ethical practice of the *Torah*. The development of *halachah* made Judaism portable and not dependent on being in a particular place at a particular time (i.e., able to travel to the Temple for the pilgrimage festivals). Without this unique history, Jews, as a unique people tied to a tiny, hotly contested piece of geography, might have been absorbed by the tides of time and cease to exist.

Let us fervently pray for the comfort and recovery of our dear temple members and friends and for the continued strength of their careaivers.


New Memorial Plaques
