Reception from the Chalice at Sunday Mass..

Since the time of the COVID pandemic, many communities have been cautious about distributing the Precious Blood in Mass at Holy Communion. It is a long standing Catholic belief that the entirety of the Lord's Eucharistic presence is found in reception of the host alone. But it is equally true that the sign value of receiving from the chalice alongside the host gives the fullest expression of our Eucharistic understanding. Bishop Paul is keen that, keeping good hygiene measures in place, reception from the chalice in Mass should continue. I sounded this out at the last parish council meeting, and we have decided to reintroduce people's reception of the Precious Blood at Sunday Masses from the First Sunday of Advent onward (November 30th). Would those who are Eucharistic ministers in our communities please stand by to assist with this ministry at Sunday Masses? Thank you. Fr Stephen.

When the Roman Emperor Constantine legalised Christianity within the Empire, he gave several gifts of land and money to the Church (often referred to as the "Donation of Constantine") this included building a Basilica over St Peter's Tomb, and providing land and building a Cathedral Church for the Bishop of Rome (The Pope), These buildings on the Lateran Hill in Rome included a palace in which the Pope could reside in magnificence. The Lateran Palace is still there, but nowadays the Popes live in Vatican City at St Peter's. St John's Cathedral (the Lateran Basilica) is infact the Pope's Cathedral, and as such is often described as "the mother and head of all the churches of the City and the World". So today this feast is a celebration of a building, and history, but especially of our Catholic identity.

There is always coffee after Mass on Sunday at St Anne's in the house. All are welcome.
