Dear Sisters in Christ,

I would like to tell you about our new state project that we voted for at the 54th Biennial CDA State Convention. Our new state project is Stepping Stones Ministries in Bismarck. Stepping Stones Ministries is a new non-profit that was organized to provide transitional care for homeless individuals who are still too ill to return to the streets or shelters, but no longer require, or qualify for, acute care or other healthcare destinations in the Bismarck/Mandan and surrounding areas.


They want to provide a safe and healing environment while the individuals recover. With their community partners, they foster connections that would promote access to stable housing, along with access to recovery services and health care, to increase independence, and help to end the cycle of homelessness.

They know that individuals that don't have housing experience higher levels of chronic health conditions, including mental health and substance abuse challenges, and these conditions are intensified by lack of shelter, sleep, access to food and health care.

They believe that by providing an environment that is safe in which to recover from illness, while helping access other essential services, they will be caring for the unmet needs of homeless persons and improving the overall health of the community they serve.

May we as Catholic Daughters help them meet their needs.

I appreciate your trust in me in my role as the State Treasurer for the past four years. Thank you so much for the opportunity to remain on the State Board. I look forward to my new role as the new Second Vice State Regent.

As I mentioned in my last article, the offerings collected on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday were earmarked for specific donations. Everyone was very generous. We collected \$821 for vocations, which will be split evenly between the Dioceses of Bismarck and Fargo, \$980.07 for the past State Project, Project Ignite Light, and \$1023 for the new State Project, Stepping Stone Ministries.

The funds for Project Ignite Light will be added to other Local Court donations received since February 2025, when the last donation was sent for Giving Hearts Day. So, a final amount of \$1080.07 will be sent to Project Ignite Light. We gave them a total of \$5335.08 over the past two years, of which \$4,300 was designated for Giving Hearts Day, increasing the total funds they ultimately received. This is in addition to items several Courts and individual members have provided over the past two years to be used in the Bags of Hope provided to children in need.

A variety of baskets were donated for the Live and Silent Auctions. Twenty-seven baskets were auctioned during the live auction held after supper on Friday evening. The auctioneers kept it very lively and raised \$2,460. There were 44 baskets designated for the Silent Auction, which were available for bidding on Friday and Saturday. It closed after the banquet Saturday evening and raised \$2543. We also collected a total of \$375 from the State Court's share of the 50/50 raffles held on Friday and Saturday.

I would like to thank everyone for their generosity. It is greatly appreciated.


