

Newark-Wayne Community Hospital recently earned Magnet Recognition through the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC). Magnet Recognition is the highest and most prestigious distinction a healthcare organization can receive for nursing excellence and high-quality patient care. With only 8% of U.S. hospitals earning the Magnet designation, it's clearly the gold standard.

The ANCC's 5 Model Magnet Components are: transformational leadership, structural empowerment, exemplary professional practice, new knowledge, innovation, and improvements, and empirical quality results.

In addition, the Magnet Commission presented Newark-Wayne Community Hospital with 6 patient exemplars, all outperforming the national benchmark for:

- #1 Preventing falls with injury
- #2 Preventing hospital-acquired pressure ulcers
- #3 Preventing central line associated blood stream infection (CLABSI)
- #4 Preventing catheter-associated urinary tract infections (CAUTI)
- #5 Preventing Emergency Department readmissions
- #6 Short wait times (door-to-provider) in the Emergency Department
