

## Clifford Township Supervisors Meeting January 5, 2015

Business meeting held on Tuesday January 5, 2015. Chairman Dennis Knowlton called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Motion to approve the minutes by Mr. Knowlton, second by Mr. Searle. All in favor. Treasurer's report reviewed and will be put on file. List of bills reviewed. Mr. Marcho made a motion to pay bills except Clifford Auto and Clifford supply, seconded by Mr. Searle. All in favor. Mr. Searle made a motion to pay Clifford Auto and Clifford Supply, seconded by Mr. Knowlton. All in favor. Mr. Marcho abstained due to potential conflict of interest.

Mr. Searle made a motion to approve the Ordinance to keep PSATS as the Township Unemployment Trust. Seconded by Mr. Marcho. All in favor.

Mr. Searle made a motion to have a study done to see if the township could name state roads. Seconded by Mr. Knowlton. All in favor.

Mr. Knowlton made a motion to set May 2<sup>nd</sup> as the Great American Clean Up date. Seconded by Mr. Searle. All in favor.

Mr. Marquiz complained about kids in the building without adult supervision and using the hall to throw balls around. Mr. Marcho will have the group that is working on rules and regulation on the building usage police address the problem.

Mr. Knowlton made a motion to spend up to \$15000.00 for playground equipment and benches. Seconded by Mr. Searle. All in favor.

Tax Collector: Closing the books for the year with 90-95% collected which is average.

Community Report: Township looking for help with recycling 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday every month.

Historical Society: Mrs. Wilmot reported that the Cider Mill is enclosed and coming along spectacularly because of the help of Eddy Marquiz, Jerry Lewandowski and mark Wilmot. With a little luck they hope to be pressing cider by fall. An 1890's family farm will be added to the museum this year, work to begin within a few weeks with hopes to have it done by May. Two Grants was awarded for advertisement, newsletter and web page and for the fireman's picnic.
