Thank you to everyone who came out in support at the recent White Seabass hatchery town hall meetings. We had great support from grow out pen operators past and present. There were anglers, teachers, students, marine scientists, divers and environmental groups that all showed up in support. At the meetings there was consistent support for the following items:

1. We believe the WSB hatchery program has been a success as a research study of how to spawn, raise and release hatchery fish in the ocean.

- 2. We want the white seabass program to continue
- 3. We don't believe the stock assessment or tag study are in any way accurate to reflect what is out on the water today. The math may be correct, but the data is flawed as well as the conclusions being reached. WSB are being caught from Washington to Baja and out to Tanner and Cortez banks. The study is not accounting for any of the environmental conditions or release improvements made in the last 5 years.
- 4. We don't believe in the mortality rate numbers being posted. No proof of mortality has been shown. Just a conclusion reached from bad data.
- 5. We do believe there is a correlation between our hatchery program and the increase sea lion and pelican populations.
- 6. We want the program to reevaluate how studies are conducted, the modeling used, and how conclusions are formulated.
- 7. We think the Advisory Panel needs to have more authority in providing direction for the program and that the program leadership needs to be improved.
- 8. We think the current fish pathologist is biased and needs to be replaced and more fair standards need to be implemented.
- 9. We need the funding for this program reinstated and even increased so it can expand into other species and don't think we should have a fee increase to pay for it. There is money sitting in the fund and not being used for this program.

- 11. We want to expand this program to include Halibut as the next species and need to expand the broodstock of WSB and halibut in Mission Bay
- 12. We love the Sea Bass in the Classroom program and want it to be expanded.

12 Month California Fishing License Still in the Works

12-Month Fishing Bills Update Assembly Bill 986:

AB 986, <u>James Gallagher</u>, aims to increase fishing license sales and revenue by making an annual fishing license valid for 12-months from the date of purchase. This bill also discounts annual fishing licenses for American veterans by 25%, and by 50% for veterans that have a 50% or greater service-connected disability.

Status: Passed unanimously out of the Senate Committee on Natural Resources and Water on June 12th and will be heard in the Senate Committee on Veterans Affairs on June 26th.

Senate Bill 518:

SB 518, Tom Berryhill, (formerly SB 187) aims to increase California's fishing participation rate and economic activity by creating an annual license that is valid a full 12-months from the date of purchase with a auto-renewal option. Today, SB 518 enjoys the support of an impressive coalition of state and local organizations representing small business, labor, local government, travel, hospitality, marina and lake operators, as well as the boating industry.

Status: Passed out of the Assembly Committee on Water, Parks and Wildlife to the Appropriations Committee on consent on June 12th and will be heard in the Assembly Committee on Appropriations on June 27th.

You have a voice in the political process. Contact Assembly Member Gonzalez Fletcher and ask her to support SB 518 today!

Assembly Member GonzalezFletcher is chair of the Assembly Appropriations Committee, and the bill (formerly SB 187) was killed in her committee without a vote in 2017.
