With the approach of Christmas, I keep thinking about something that happened to me recently at a McDonald's drive-thru. I was sitting there, hungry for my Egg McMuffin I had just ordered, when I pulled up to the window and the employee said, "Your meal has been paid for by the gentleman ahead of you."

I just sat there for a second. That's the first time anything like that has ever happened to me. No announcement, no expectation, no angle, just a simple gift from a stranger who asked for nothing in return. And I've got to tell you, it hit me in a way I didn't expect. It felt like the gift of grace showing up in a paper bag.

Isn't that the heart of Christmas? A gift we didn't ask for, appearing unexpectedly, reshaping the way we see the world. God slips into our lives quietly, in a manger, in a moment, in the kindness of people, some we'll never meet or see again. And suddenly, the ordinary becomes extraordinary.

This season gets noisy and frantic, but that little act of drive-thru generosity reminded me that Christmas still happens in surprising places: at a fast-food window, in a kind word, in a gesture no one notices except the person who receives it. How holy it is when love makes itself known and joy reigns supreme, even for just a few minutes.

My prayer this December is that each of us has an experience like that, unearned, unexpected, and deeply needed. And even more, that we become people who create those sacred moments for others. I know I will the next time I am at McDonald's.



Greetings from your Parish Nurse....

I'm having a hard time wrapping my mind around the fact that it is December and the Christmas Season has come already! Anyone else feel that way?

The last few days, I've been thinking about gifts—both the giving of gifts and receiving. Often one of these areas is difficult for us. It may be giving a gift—will they like it? Have I kept my gifting equal? How will I get it to them? What if they don't like it?

But receiving gifts can be just as difficult. Did I express my thanks? I feel like I don't deserve this. This is more than the gift I gave to them, etc., etc. We certainly overthink our gifts don't we?

In thinking about it, I have just a few things to suggest. I was talking with a friend the other day who is temporarily in need of some extra emotional and physical support. She may just need to talk for a bit. Or may need a ride to the grocery store or an errand run for her. One of her other friends had called and offered to help her. As she talked to me about this, she said, "I don't want to lose a friendship because I ask too much right now." She was having a difficult time accepting this gift of friendship at this time.

I reminded her that the friend had offered to help and others may offer too! I finally said "Please don't keep this other friend from the gift she receives by helping you. When we help others, our endorphins go up. It makes us feel good and gives us a purpose. So don't cheat her of that experience!"

I know it may be a convoluted way to think of it, but when you need help and someone offers that assistance, be willing to accept it!

It made me think about my gift giving as well. Instead of getting caught up in all the physical gifts, could I focus on giving myself to others in some way? And as I thought, there are lots of ways to do that! Some ideas are:

- Oive a smile to a stranger! You never know what a difference it can make.
- ♦ Give a tip to someone in your world that you know is struggling—a little extra for a waitress, a tip for your groundskeeper, maybe a tip for your hairdresser. You can think of many others that don't have all the extras.
- Give time to someone who is lonely. Look around in your neighborhood or activities. There are always people that feel that they are on the "outside." Maybe invite a neighbor in for tea and cookies. Or take someone out for a Christmas Concert. Maybe just call someone, ask questions and listen. If they are lonely and need to talk, you may not have to say much if anything!
- How about telling your family a story from your past—of you growing up and experiences you had. If you have a picture to go along with it, even better!
- Invite some people over to play cards, or dominoes or some other simple game. Games are a great way to be able to talk and get to know each other without awkward silences.
- Give the gift of forgiveness. Is there someone in your life that you have been meaning to communicate with and forgive the past? Now is a great time to do it.
- ♦ Give the gift of encouragement. Instead of just signing your Christmas cards, how about if you put in 2-3 sentences about what that person means to you. What they have done for you, or maybe just saying how much you love them. As the commercial says, Christmas Card…\$2. Words of encouragement and love...Priceless!

I'm sure you can come up with many more ideas. But think about giving the gift of yourself this Christmas. And think about accepting gracefully the lovely gestures from others.


It's time to THINK SOUP!



This is a chance to try something new and stimulate some creative areas of our brain. No past experience with painting is required.









United Church of Sun City has an outstanding Music Ministry! So many factors come together to make a Sunday morning church service a success... our staff, volunteers, technology, production crew and YOU!!

The "Video Village" is where slides are projected on the screen, church service recordings are generated, and sound volumes for the Praise Team, Choir and pulpit are controlled each week. A minimum of two technicians are needed to ensure all of these things run smoothly without fault. However, technology has a mind of its own where sometimes, things do not go as planned. Our goal is to create the best worship quality of sound and video for our in-house guests and on-line viewers.

Much of the equipment we use is old. Some of it is original equipment from when the church was built back in the 1960s! It has become increasingly difficult to stay current with new equipment while maintaining the old equipment. Sunday morning services have become challenging, to say the least; controlling volume, feedback from microphones, salvaging older equipment to "make things work" all the while trying to provide the best sound and visual quality for you and our on-line viewers.

In the past five years, we have received grant funds of \$8,000 for upgrades to our sound and video equipment. We have purchased a new video recording camera, two new computers and programs for the PowerPoint slides and video recordings, new choir mics, and expanded work space for our production crew.

In July of this past year, AV Experts (Audio Visual Experts out of Phoenix, AZ) spent some time in our Sanctuary analyzing our equipment and providing us with suggestions on how to improve quality without sacrificing our existing equipment. It has been a learning experience. AV Experts has provided us with several estimates providing upgrades to our AV equipment bringing us up to current technology standards. It is our goal, in 2026, to implement this new technology and provide Sunday morning worship at United Church with an even more enhanced worship experience. And lets not forget concerts, special events and our Christmas and Easter Cantatas with the Phoenix Symphony!

We need your help! In the coming year, we will be having fundraisers, selling tickets, having craft fairs, special Valentine's dinners, auctions, and many other little ways we can engage you in our fundraising efforts. Of course, generous donations are always accepted. United Church prides itself on functioning without debt and it is our intent to keep it that way. Currently, there are funds set aside to kickstart our AV Project, but we need YOUR help to carry us the rest of the way. Please prayerfully consider joining us in our fundraising activities, donations and getting enthused about improving our sound and visual quality every Sunday morning for years to come.

This is all for YOU, our United Church family, and we want you to become a part of it's success!
