Students gathered with excited anticipation of the annual Rock Auction to begin. They had emptied their piggy banks and done extra chores in preparation of this evening; they had hopes of purchasing treasured items to add to their personal collections at home. Tables had been rearranged from end to end and circled around to allow continuous flow of students with their parents. Fossils, all manner of rock material and minerals were on display. Following flag salute and instructions, the auction began. The students circled around, parents in tow, writing their initials and bid amounts, hoping to get their favorite items. Lots of time was given; there was no reason to rush. Even the youngest in our class had plenty of time to circle around the tables and increase their bid of favorite hopeful purchases. As students slowed, end of auction time warning was given and soon the buzzer rang and pencils were put down. Students and parents collected auction items won.

#### 2020 SILENT AUCTION RULES

- A silent auction round will be 30 minutes in duration. The first of the day will end at 10:45 am, so as not to interfere with the calling of door prizes.
- NO BIDDING while working behind the tables and NO socializing with non-workers behind the tables.
- All items must be paid for at the end of the auction round & there will be no storing of materials for club members behind the tables.
- Only volunteers that are pre-signed up are allowed behind the tables unless someone is filling in for a no-show.
- The chairs behind the tables are for the auction-workers use only.

#### 4) 2 Hour Auctions:

• There will be 3 two hour auctions each day (hour and a half on last one on Sunday) for higher value items, and a limit of two items per family, per auction for each session unless there is a shortage of material for the table. The bid sheets for the **2 Hour auctions** are on colored paper, the ½ hour auctions on white. Please print your name clearly on the slip as well as what the item is. Fill in the beginning bid price on the white sheets. On the 2 hour colored sheets, put in your BUY IT NOW price, and an opening bid below. **BUY IT NOW** seems to sell better if that price runs about \$10 to \$15 above opening bid amount. Each sheet should be attached to its item with a rubber band.

A 4% cover charge will be added to the buyer's total to cover card user charges.

• The payout on sales is 70% to owner, 30% to club. If you want a certain amount for your item, please figure out that amount in your 70% return and write that on your slip as the opening bid. If you have any questions regarding this new payout, please contact Wayne Larson.

If an item does not sell, it will be removed from the table and set aside for another sale round or set aside for the owner to claim later.

#### 5) Consignment Sales:

• Items may be consigned to sell at the half-hour auctions. Fill out a white bid sheet and attach it to the item with a rubber band or tape. **Print your name clearly and check the "consign-ment" box on the sheet.** If no box is checked, it is assumed that it is a donation. Bid slips will be available at the April meeting so club members can prepare their items for sale. We suggest you open your ½ hour bids with at least a \$1.00 amount.
