Presiding Commissioner, Kyle Carroll, West District Commissioner, Kyle White, East District Commissioner Garry McFee and County Clerk , Melissa Meek.

Presiding Commissioner, Kyle Carroll, East District Commissioner, Garry McFee and West District Commissioner, Kyle White welcomed those in attendance with Kyle Carroll leading the group in prayer followed by the reciting of the Pledge of Allegiance.

West District Commissioner, Kyle White made the motion to amend the agenda to add Accounts Payable with East District Commissioner, Garry McFee making the motion to approve amending the agenda. Motion carried. West District Commissioner, Kyle White made the motion to approve the agenda as presented as well as the minutes from the October 6th meeting with East District Commissioner, Garry McFee making the second. County Clerk, Melissa Meek advised the Commission of the procedures she is working on for the November 3rd General Election.

West District Commissioner, Kyle White attended the Region D meeting that was held on October 8th I Clarksdale.

County Clerk, Melissa Meek presented the sales tax reports for September where they continue to look good for the County.

At 10 a.m. members from The City of Maysville, The City of Cameron, The Great Northwest Wholesale Water Commission and concerned citizens met with the Commission concerning the waterline project. Those in attendance were as follows: City of Maysville Clerk, Pat Fisher-Johnson, City of Maysville Councilman, Paul Niece, City of Cameron Attorney, Padraic Cocoran, GNWWC Chariman, Zac Johnson, City Manager of Cameron, Steve Rasmussen and Todd Archer, Engineer for CDM Smith. Discussion continued concerning the Great Northwest Wholesale Water Commission's requests to cut the roads in DeKalb County to install their water line. The concern continues to be the cost to bore versus the costs to cut and how maintenance will be done if the water commission is allowed to cut said roads in DeKalb County. West District Commissioner, Kyle White advised he had discussed with a board member from Washington, Colfax, Camden and Grand River on which they would prefer if they had a say and they all agreed they would like to see the roads bored. The Commission advised they will try and have the water commission an answer concerning this in the next couple of weeks. They will meet again on October 20 for a short meeting.

Road & Bridge Supervisor, Bill Gray met with the Commission and gave them an update on the meeting he and his staff attended. Bill felt the meeting was very informative and appreciates the ability to attend these yearly meetings. Also discussed was equipment needs, roads and the 911 tower that will be moved to the road & bridge grounds.

Mary Jo Hayter, Debbie Davis, TJ Sethi and Barb Denny were in attendance to present Mary Jo Hayter with an award for being a dedicated volunteer in 4-H for 23 years. Debbie is a County Engagement Specialist in 4-H Youth Development, Barb and TJ both are employed with the University of Missouri Extension Office all working out of the Extension Office in Cameron. Mary Jo became the club leader of the High Hopes 4-H Club in 1997 serving the youth of DeKalb County until 2007. In addition to being a club leader she also led projects in horses, foods, sewing and served on the DeKalb County Extension Council. The Commission and all in attendance thanked Mary Jo for her service to the youth and 4-H.
