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# Civic Report

On March 8th, 2017, the Public Works Committee meeting heard the Traffic Action Plan for four neighborhoods - Glendale Village, Fiesta Gardens, North Shoreview, and North Central. The presentations consisted of the top 10 actions each community requested to ease the growing traffic congestion. For Fiesta Gardens this included:

- 1. Make 19th Ave. two-way between Delaware and Grant to reduce flow through Bermuda.
- 2. Make Bermuda Avenue between Delaware and Ginnever oneway to reduce congestion.
- 3. Issue parking permits in areas impacted by new developments.
- 4. Install speed cushions on Bermuda/Texas/Fiesta.
- 5. Paint corners and cross-walks for parking and pedestrian safety.
- 6. Add a left-turn into Bermuda from south-bound Delaware.
- 7. Install portable radar board on Grant/Bermuda and conduct speed/volume counts.
- 8. City staff meet with school officials to address circulation issues during pickup/drop off hours. 9. Consider re-opening 19th avenue gate from Fiesta Gardens school during morning drop off hours.
- 10. Staff officials meet with Fire and Police to determine if alternative access to the neighborhood is needed (ingress/egress at Saratoga Drive).

Obviously #10 was a huge red flag. As a result, three board members met with Brad Underwood from the Public Works Department before the meeting to discuss and get updates on the Sewage Tank plans and raise opposition to any attempts to open Saratoga. He reassured us that Saratoga was already discounted as an option. However, I feel that we need to keep an eye and ear open to make certain other attempts are not made to open up our neighborhood.

The PWC meeting did not result in any formal recommendations for the TAP. However, there was discussion regarding the budget – meager \$400,000 per year for two years, with a small amount of additional discretionary funds. If distributed evenly, that would only be \$60,000 per neighborhood. Hardly enough to do anything. It is likely that money will be spent in areas of greatest need. Cara Cox of the PWC was vocal that Fiesta Gardens get well-earned relief.

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As to the question of developers building Bay Meadows and Station Green paying infrastructure charges to improve Traffic flow, the answers to this were unsatisfactory and I will be following up with the City for exact details.

Finally, there was the comment that the city-wide Sustainability Initiatives are designed to get people out of cars, so why are we planning to widen streets and create better traffic flow? I would ask them how they plan to reduce the number of car journeys in a neighborhood where they are building more than two thousand new residences with plenty of parking.

The update from Brad regarding the Sewage Tank is optimistic. The board of the Events Center is very interested in having the Tank on their property. There are more negotiations planned, so we will see. Of course, the city may be pushing that so they can go ahead and develop the corporate yard with more houses. That will be the next fight. The current PEIR reviews of the two sites will be complete by early fall and then it will go to the council for final approval. Building will probably not start until late 2018/early 2019.


