NOTICE OF CLUB T SHIRT CHANGE

At the September 7th Turners Club Board meeting, it was decided that the club would end the annual practice of supplying a new Tee shirt to every regular member as part of the annual membership. The cost of the shirts has risen over the years and there is no longer a \$10 Tee shirt to be had despite the discount rates we have received for many years from Leadmasters company. Shirts go higher than \$16 each sometimes. If you remember, we stopped providing shirts to our honorary members a few years back with the option of allowing them to purchase the shirts at a discounted rate. The Board did not want to raise the dues this year to cover the cost of the shirts. Many members have expressed that they have plenty of tee shirts as well. The plan is to have a Club tee shirt available for purchase by the members. Once we have our own design, we may be able to expand it to other types of shirts and clothing items. 
Members Reports



Dan held the boat awhile waiting for Will but he was a no show so we headed out of San Francisco Bay and up the Marin coastline. Fishing at the Farallon Islands Saturday was deemed too rough, with 15 foot waves. We basically stayed within the Marin Headlands area, moving only a couple of times. It was primarily rockfish and Lings. I got a text from Will Ebersman about 1130 that he wasn't making the trip at all. William filled his sack easily while I wasn't doing as well. Despite fishing right next to him and using the same bait, etc, I still don't know why his fish were 3 times the size of mine. I quit fishing early as I was pretty beat up by the rail. I didn't feel like going out that night so we ordered room service again.

Sunday morning we fished the Sea Wolf for the first time. Another of the SF boats without a galley. This time the plan was the Farallons so we stored our gear and got ready for the long ride out there. The waves were better Sunday, I wasn't crashing against the rail for a change. Captain Shawn had additional deckhands on board to help. It was bigger rockfish and lings. Lots of small lings in with some nicer ones too. William hooked at least 3 lings but was unable to land them due to interference from some locals fishing near me. (That's putting it nicely.) We had a late lunch, then called it a day. By 2PM we had to head back to the city anyway. It was nice to get away no matter what.
