- ❖ Pansies, Snapdragons, & petunias are very cold hardy. They are safe to put out early. The temperatures actually make them stronger, nicer plants.
- ❖ Perennials can go out any time. Make sure that they have been hardened off if it is still cold outside. Hardening off means that they should be acclimatized to the weather outside before you plant them.
- Grapes & Berries are also safe to plant. We receive our starts in March. It is an ideal time plant berries and grapes.

❖ Hardy and Semi Hardy Veggies (March –May)These Vegetables actually

- prefer the cooler weather.
