# Intervention: Not As Seen on TV

Most people who consume alcohol or drugs do not develop alcoholism or chemical dependency. However, 10-20% of the

population is at high risk of progressing to the harmful phase of Substance Use Disorder (SUD). Notably, 90% of SUD cases begin during the teenage years. This statistic underscores the importance of intervening with teenagers who experiment with drugs or alcohol.

Early Intervention is not as dramatic as portrayed on TV. Teenagers often lack the understanding that drug or alcohol use can significantly alter their life trajectory. They typically live at home, attend school, and socialize with friends. When they get caught using substances, they may face consequences like being grounded at home, probation and drug tests by the law, or in-school suspension or transfer to an Alternative School.

These deterrents are effective for most teenagers, but not for those with the Disease of Substance Use Disorder. An estimated 10-20% of teenagers are in at least the early stages of this disease. Would you wait to see if a skin cancer continues to grow, or would you seek a professional opinion at an early stage? Naturally, the best deterrent is professional help.

RecoveryWerks! uses the APG (Alternative Peer Group) model to support teenagers using substances and their families. If a young person has the disease of addiction, trying to control their behavior is futile. Their behavior results from their drug use, not the other way around. You cannot "outparent" a disease. Seeking help through an APG or RecoveryWerks! is the path to long-term recovery.


