Presiding Commissioner, Kyle Carroll, West District Commissioner, Kyle White, East District Commissioner, Garry McFee and County Clerk, Melissa Meek.

Addressing the Commission on this day was Presiding Circuit Judge Brent Elliott, Circuit Judge Ryan Horsman and 43rd Circuit Court Marshall, Robert Mazur. The Commission voiced their concerns over who had jurisdiction over the Courthouse concerning this order and during this pandemic. It was determined that the County will do the best it can to comply with the orders handed down from the Supreme Court. County Clerk, Melissa Meek will order masks that will be available for patrons if they need one when entering the building.
