High on the list of concerns is 36 & Bob Griffin Rd as well as Ensign Trace and 36 Hwy. The Commission voiced their displeasure on roads not being maintained by MODOT due to funding but hope with MOKAN's input this will change.

The Commission received a letter from the Department of Conservation concerning the PILOT (Payment In Lieu of Taxes) lawsuit that is still ongoing. The amount of money the County receives from this each year is less than \$2,000.00.

The Commission discussed the response from the Department of Corrections regarding an inquiry about using part of the closed Crossroads Correctional Facility as a regional jail. The DeKalb County Commission has no interest at this time in pursing DOC facilities for an expanded regional jail.

Road & Bridge Supervisor, Bill Gray met with the Commission to discuss the possibility of contractor labor in lieu of part time help, equipment, tubes and work being done around the County.

Rory Stegman of CTS, met with the Commission to discuss the heating and cooling units in the Courthouse and the need for a new or different system at Sunset Nursing Home. A portable unit for the kitchen was to be acquired.

The Attorney General has invited The Commission to an open house at his office in Jefferson City on August 10^{th} . At this time they will be traveling to Jefferson City to attend and will meet in regular session on August 17 at their regular time.
