Lots were first made available at Ramsey Bay in 1976 and at present 216 cabins have been built. Organization of the Weyakwin Cottage Owners Association was initiated in 1977 and it was incorporated as a membership Non-Profit Corporation on November 18, 1980.

During the past 38 years many changes have taken place. Cabins have changed hands, been improved or replaced and many of the original young couples are spending their retirement years here. Some of their children and grandchildren are now also enjoying the serenity of our northern resort community.

Besides the lake and beaches there is a privately operated campground, public docks and boat launches and managed filleting sheds. There are also individuals who operate a bed and breakfast and storage compound. We have groomed trails for cross country skiing, designated and groomed snowmobile trails and a snowmobile club for winter enjoyment. We also get a lot of pleasure from fishing year round.

Many residents get together every chance they can, at regularly scheduled public events held at the community recreation hall and at private residences. These gatherings include pot luck suppers, holiday weekend events and celebrations, pancake breakfasts, perogy and cabbage making get-togethers, a book club, birthday get-togethers, card games and other fun activities hosted by Ramsey Bay community associations. However, if your preference is peaceful solitude that is also close at hand.
