President's Thoughts Blarney Stone vs. Runestone

"Top of the morning to you." I guess maybe one day out of the year on March 17th I can speak such words. But during the rest of the year, I find it much easier when getting up in the morning just to say "Uffda". I also find it very simplistic that all one has to do to be Irish, is to just wear something green on this date called St. Patrick's Day.



But yet I suppose that each of us do indeed have some Irish in our blood as the result of our Vikings invading Ireland during the 9th & 10th Centuries. And as we all know, if it were not for the Vikings discovering America, after they were through with Ireland, we would all still be living in teepees and eating cornmeal instead of lutefisk.

And as our Norwegian Heritage has grown through the centuries, we as descendants provide festivities such as eating a cold breakfast that we call Frokost. This will happen on April 19th, as a celebration to welcome the season of Spring. If you have ever wanted to have a traditional Bunad (the

national dress/costume), we are hosting a Bunad Workshop to give everyone the opportunity to make their own Bunad during the week after our Frokost. And starting on the first Monday of April you have a chance to learn the art of making Lefse, and every Monday morning thereafter. All of these wonderful events and activities will lead up to the 201st annual celebration of the Norwegian Constitution Day known as Syttende Mai on May 17th.

But, I know that some of you will be celebrating with the Irish this month, and that's okay. Just make sure that you stick a piece of Lefse somewhere in that article of green clothing.

Dennie E. Laux Sep 20,1931-Jan 9, 2015



Dennie was born in Grand Chute, Wisconsin, to Joseph and Margaret Laux. He attended school in Appleton, Wisconsin, graduating in 1949. He enlisted in the Army in that year and by the winter of 1950, was serving very near the Yalu River in the far north of Korea. After Chinese troops entered the war, he served valiantly in the break-out and march from the Chosin reservoir to Hungnam, well known for its difficulty under the most despairing and miserable conditions. He served with distinction in Company C of the 11th Field Artillery Battalion, receiving 3 Bronze Stars for his actions.

He was a printer by trade and married Kay in 1989. They were active in our Folk Dance group and served as Lodge Marshals for several years. Dennie did a lot of heavy lifting for the Lutefisk dinners held at Benet Hill for over 30 years.

He is survived by daughters Kristine, Karen and Dawn and five grandchildren.

We remember with appreciation and affection this quiet, gentle man whose service to our country we learned only after his passing.
