




Trinity Lutheran Church 125th Anniversary

Advent Midweek Services

Magnificat! This year we will focus on Mary's words in Luke 1 called the Magnificat. Magnificat tells the story of God's people, but also gives voice to what God has done for us in Jesus Christ. It speaks to what kind of people we are and what kind of people Christ enables us to be. A special feature of these services will be singing different settings of the Magnificat found in Lutheran Service Book.

Advent services will start Wednesday, December 4 at 7 pm. There are three Advent services this year: Dec. 4, 11, and 18.

both 3:16-21 ¹⁶ For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. ¹⁷ For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. ¹⁸ Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God. ¹⁹ And this is the judgment: the light has come into the world, and people loved the darkness rather than the light because their deeds were evil. ²⁰ For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his deeds should be exposed. ²¹ But whoever does what is true comes to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that his deeds have been carried out in God.

Our life as Christians is lived in the light of God which comes to us in Jesus Christ. This light touches both the outside and inside of our lives. As you journey into Advent and Christmas journey in that light of Christ which exposes ourselves to His presence, compassion, and enduring love for us- where we are. He meets us where we are on promises to be there, and carry us through until eternal day.

ESV Revelation 22:1 Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb ² through the middle of the street of the city; also, on either side of the river, the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, yielding its fruit each month. The leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations. ³ No longer will there be anything accursed, but the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him. ⁴ They will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. ⁵ And night will be no more. They will need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever.

From Pastor's Desk...

"What?! You can't tell from the outside! This is unbelievable." That was the response from the State of Iowa Elevator Inspector when I told him that the elevator no longer was in use because of the flood. With his mouth gaped he walked into the lower basement bewildered by the flood damage. That's how many of you have responded, too. From the outside things look fairly normal, even the sanctuary looks the same. You wouldn't know anything unless you went in the basement. Underground you really see the damage; a true picture of how bad things are.

The Church Year ends and begins in Advent with a similar message–Jesus is coming. At the end it is the coming of Christ at the end of time, at the beginning it is the promise of Jesus coming in the flesh at Christmas mixed with the promise that He will return in all His God-man glory. This message combined with the lights and trees and decorations of the Advent-Christmas season give a traditional, if not normal, picture of this time of year.

That's just the outside- inside there's a lot more. More brokenness, more heart-ache, more loneliness, more fear. There will be those celebrating Christmas with the first time without mom or dad, their spouse, a child, or old friends. There will be those who hear the news that they need treatments for cancer, new medicine, or possible surgery. There will be those who build themselves up in holiday sins of gluttony, greed, selfishness, and pride. Emotions may rage, beat down, and crush any holiday cheer. All of this may not be observed by most of us, but they will be there underground, behind the "everything looks ok from the outside."

Jesus comes as the light who illuminates our darkness-darkness on the inside and darkness on the outside. He draws us to the light like a moth. His light exposes what is on the inside and outside in order to give us Jesus. John says it this way:

^{ESV} **John 1:1-5** In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was in the beginning with God. ³ All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. ⁴ In him was life, and the life was the light of men. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.
