Thanks for joining me for a June Mini-Singalong! Have fun!!


In this program, we'll be happily singing to simplified-unedited-living roomversions of some Summer favorites. The harmony and backup accompaniment are tracks I pre-recorded.

1. IN THE GOOD OLD SUMMERTIME

1902. Music: George Evans; Lyrics: Ren Shields. Became the title song for the1949 Judy Garland movie.

2. SENTIMENTAL JOURNEY

1944. Music: Les Brown and Ben Homer; Lyrics: Bud Green. The 1945 Doris Day version became the unofficial theme song for many returning World War II veterans.

3. BY THE LIGHT OF THE SILVERY MOON

1909. Music: Gus Edwards; Lyrics: Edward Madden. First performed at the Ziegfeld Follies by Lillian Lorraine.

By the light of the silvery moon, I want to spoon, to my honey I'll croon love's tune. Honeymoon, keep a shinin' in June, You're silvery beams will bring loves' dreams. We'll be cuddlin' soon, by the silvery moon. (**Repeat**)



4. TELL ME WHY

Traditional folk song.

Tell me why the stars do shine; Tell me why the ivy twines. Tell me why the ocean's blue; And I will tell you just why I love you.

Because He made the stars to shine; Because He made the ivy twine. Because He made the ocean blue; Because He made you, That's why I love you!

5. DOWN BY THE OLD MILL STREAM

1910. Music and Lyrics: Tell Taylor. One of the most popular songs of the early 20th century.

Down by the Old Mill Stream, where I first met you. With your eyes of blue, dressed in gingham too. It was there I knew that you loved me true. You were sixteen, my village queen. Down by the Old Mill Stream.



6. YOU, YOU, YOU

1953. Music: Lotar Olias; Lyrics: Original German Walter Rothenberg. English Lyrics: Robert Mellin. The Ames Brothers version reached #1 on the Billboard charts in 1953.

You, you, you. I'm in love with you, you, you. I could be so true, true, true, to someone like you, you, you. Do, do, do, what you ought to do, do, do. Take me in your arms please do; Let me cling to you, you, you.

We were meant for each other, sure as heaven's above! We were meant for each other, to have to hold and to love. You, you, you. There's no one like you, you, you. You could make my dreams come true, If you say you love me too.

7. WHISPERING HOPE

1868. Music and Lyrics: Septimus Winner, written under the name Alice Hawthorne.

Soft as the voice of an angel, breathing a lesson unheard. Hope with a gentle persuasion whispers a comforting word.

Wait, till the darkness is over,

Wait, till the tempest is done.


Hope, for the sunshine tomorrow

1939. Music and Lyrics (disputed): Jimmie Davis and Charles Mitchell

You are my starshine, my wondrous starshine You make me happy when skies are gray You'll never know dear, how much I love you Please don't take my starshine away!

9. GOD BLESS AMERICA!

1918. Music and Lyrics: Irving Berlin. The song was revised by Berlin in 1938 and became Kate Smith's signature song.

God Bless America, Land that I love. Stand beside her, and guide her Thru the night with a light from above. From the mountains, to the prairies, To the oceans, white with foam! God bless America, My home sweet home. God bless America, My home sweet home!
