Sunday Reflection: Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus clarifies His relationship to the Law, emphasizing continuity and fulfillment. He asserts, "Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have come not to abolish but to fulfill." This statement reminds us that the commandments are not obsolete but find their deepest meaning in Christ. Through Him, the Law is not only observed externally but lived authentically in the heart, guiding our thoughts, intentions, and actions toward holiness. Jesus deepens our understanding of the Law, calling us beyond mere external compliance to interior transformation. He addresses the roots of sin—anger, lust, dishonesty, and broken relationships—showing that true righteousness exceeds legalistic observance. For example, He equates harboring anger with committing murder in the heart and equates lustful intent with adultery. By doing so, Jesus teaches that moral integrity requires sincerity, self-discipline, and love for God and neighbor in every dimension of life.

Moreover, Jesus stresses the importance of honesty and faithfulness, urging us to honor our word without the need for elaborate oaths. Our "yes" must mean yes, and our "no" must mean no, reflecting a life of integrity that witnesses to God's truth. This passage challenges us to embrace a holistic discipleship, where the Law is internalized and expressed through love, mercy, and justice. May we allow Christ to transform our hearts, guiding our thoughts, words, and deeds so that we live with authentic righteousness, reflecting God's holiness in every aspect of our lives.

Saint of the Week... St. Valentine of Rome

Saint Valentine of Rome is a third-century Roman saint widely celebrated on February 14 and commonly associated with "courtly love." Although not much of St. Valentine's life is reliably known, it is highly agreed that St. Valentine was martyred and then buried north of Rome.

One common story about St. Valentine is that at one point of his life he was on house arrest with Judge Asterius. While discussing religion and faith with the Judge, Valentine pledged the validity of Jesus. The judge immediately put Valentine and his faith to the test. He was presented with the judge's blind daughter and told to restore her sight. Placing his hands onto her eyes, Valentine restored the child's vision.

St. Valentine continued refusing to renounce his faith and was executed on February 14, somewhere between the years 269 and 280. He is the patron saint of love, happy marriages, beekeepers, fainting, travelers, and young people. He is often depicted with birds and roses.
