

PRESENTED by Gucci, the 4th Annual Art+Film Gala was co-chaired by Leonardo DiCaprio and Eva Chow with Gucci Creative Director Frida Giannini and a special performance by Culture Club. The Star-studded guest list was a Who's Who of notables from the art, film, fashion, and entertainment industries who gathered at the Los Angeles County Museum of Art (LACMA) to honor filmmaker Quentin Tarantino and artist Barbara Kruger-champions for LACMA's film initiatives.
