## SUPPLIES FOR PORTRAITURE PAINTING IN WATERCOLOR

## PHOTOGRAPH OF INTENDED PORTRAIT PAINTING (I can provide) WAIT ON THIS UNTIL CLASS STARTS

Face at least 4" x 6" or larger

## PAINT:

Raw Sienna (first wash)
Rose Madder Genuine or Permanent Rose
Cobalt Blue or Manganese blue hue
Aureolin or Winsor Yellow
Viridian or Winsor Green Blue Shade Burnt Sienna
French Ultramarine or Ultramarine Blue

PENCILS: 6 b and HB,( or F or \#2)
BRUSHES: 1/2" Flat, \#8 Round, Liner

## PAPER:

$9 \times 12$ pad of Canson tracing paper. (If you substitute, be sure the paper is easy to see through.
$9 \times 12$ pad of Strathmore Drawing paper
Copy paper
2 sheets of 140 \# Arches Cold Press, $11^{\prime \prime} \times 14^{\prime \prime}$ or 2 sheets 9 : x $12^{\prime \prime}$ (or 2 sheets the size that fits your portrait photograph, and some paper you can play with (has to be 140\# cold press also) (can be back of an old painting.)

## OTHER:

Pebeo masking fluid
Dish soap, mixed $1 / 2$ and $1 / 2$ with water. (You will need about a tablespoon of this, just enough to wet your brushes.)


Liquid Masking Fluid Remover (This is an Alvin Pik-Up Rubber Cement Remover)


3M tan painters masking tape
Kneaded eraser


Saral Graphite transfer paper, or you can use a window. This is for transferring the drawing onto your watercolor paper.

Smudgers or grey paper stumps


Sand paper block or sand paper
