(food for thought) (Bulletin 5 June, 2022)

Gospel: Jn 14: 15-16, 23-26 "Spirit of New Life"

For Fifty Days we have lived and breathed the miracle of Easter/Pentecost. Hopefully we have reflected and understood - better than ever before - that this is not just a spectacular episode of Salvation History that happened a long time ago, but that it still touches us with its reverberations. For us as a people of faith, Easter/Pentecost is NOW. It is the continuing invitation from our God for an ongoing, ever new encounter with Him and with others.

Jesus breathed new life into his disciples. First, by his greeting, "Peace be with you" - which were reconciling words to them after they failed him so miserably during the Passion and Crucifixion and then he bids them peace again and with that, he began a new creation by his breath - the Spirit. They are commissioned to take this reconciling peace and to proclaim it to the world. But that's not the end of the story. By his breath Jesus has given us a new Spirit. We are also re-created with the breath of life. Breathing new life into us Jesus sends us out to take his breath into the world. That is who we are.

The message of Jesus is intended for all people, in all times and places. The language of Jesus is the language of the spirit, one that transcends nationalities and all other divisive elements. We must learn the language of the Spirit. Change and diversity are integral elements of the vocabulary of the Spirit.

St. Paul tells: "As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit." (1 Cor 12:3b-7, 12-13)

Who we are and what we are is less important than what we are called to do. Jesus has breathed His Spirit into each of us and we each are part of the community of God's people... a community that is ever-changing, ever-diverse and ever-growing.
